Dear friends,

It was always a great and expected experience to meet you here. I was so delighted to share with you our celebration of AUSF 20th anniversary in Cha Am, Thailand. Also, I would like to take this opportunity to review the 20-year history of AUSF together with you, which included 2 important phases.

The first phase was from 1992 to 2002. In the 80s, representatives from Korea, China, Japan, Mongolia, Malaysia, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Chinese Taipei and Thailand were so inspired by FISU's Universiade that they decided that it was time to establish a university sports organization of Asia to foster the friendships and strengthen the communication among Asian university students. With this strong motivation, on 28th March 1992, the very 1st AUSF General Assembly was held in Bangkok, which marked the official establishment of AUSF. Since then, AUSF has grown to become one of the most active continental members of FISU and taken on the mission of facilitating the development of university sports in Asia. To this end, AUSF has gone through 20 years of hardwork.

The second phase of our development was from 2003 to 2012. During the second ten-year period, we focused our attention on the promotion and development of AUSF in the following 5 aspects. Firstly, we focused on realizing the balanced development of each sub-region including Central, East, West, South and Southeast Asia, by appointing the liaison chairs in each of these regions. Their role is to engage, respond, support and assist, and facilitate the development of university sports in these areas. We hope to reach those unreached, know their real needs and fulfill their expectation in the field of university sports. Secondly, we reviewed our approach and strategies, and re-focused on the reform of event organization by promoting the university as the participating unit for AUSF events, and at the same time developing our flagship events. Thirdly, we have enhanced the organizational structure of AUSF, electing the most united and effective Executive Committee to assist in transforming Asia's diversity into a strength and opportunity for international cooperation and exchanges, strengthening mutual understanding and trust and creating a harmonious working group. Fourthly, we have revamped the AUSF website and debuted the yearly magazine and quarterly electronic newsletter, to assist the efforts in promotion and publicity.

Looking back, we ever made some achievements, which was quite encouraging. While, looking ahead, we know that we still have a long road in front of us and we need our fellow members to finish the way we started together. Therefore, in the next 10 years, we will focus on the following areas.

First, we should focus on character development and the cultivation of our core ability. Secondly, we should continue to build up our flagship or brand name events by adopting the accepted rules and best practices in the organizing of sporting events. Thirdly, we need to step up our efforts in the area of promotion and the cultivation of relationships with all our stakeholders and sponsors. Fourthly, we need efficient and effective teams, both in the Executive Committee and the various sub committees. The journey of development of university sports is a long and uncertain one. There is no road map and quite often, we have to create new paths. Therefore, your involvement, dedication and commitment is crucial for the success of this career.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to wish you and your family a happy and harmonious new year. Hope to see you soon in next AUSF event.

Dear Friends,

It is an honour and a great pleasure for me to write an article for the wonderful magazine of the Asian University Sport Federation (AUSF).

Founded in 1992 and a FISU associate member since 2007, AUSF shows great dynamism and enthusiasm in the international university sport movement. From 10 to 35 members gained in 20 years, AUSF has managed to commit more and more university associations to its project.

I wish to pay tribute to the dynamism shown by AUSF President Zhang Xinsheng, who is also the FISU Vice-President and the FUSC President. Many actions were successfully carried out under his leadership, and today AUSF can be proud to offer a very varied sports programme which attracts more and more participants. With six continental championships held in 2012 (futsal, taekwondo, beach volleyball, men's basketball, water polo and women's volleyball), AUSF keeps strengthening its programme every year, while carrying out educational initiatives such as the recurring organisation of the "AUSF Conference".

The Asian continent is very active within FISU in terms of competitions. Let's point out the three Universiades organised in 10 years under the aegis of FUSC -in Beijing (2001 Summer Universiade), in Harbin (2009 Winter Universiade) and in Shenzhen (2011 Summer Universiade). Those events achieved huge success and led to the awarding of FUSC as the best national university sports federation during the first FISU Gala in Kazan. It is also important to mention the 2015 Summer Universiade that will take place in Gwangju, Korea, as well as the 2017 Winter and Summer Universiade which will be organised for the first time in Kazakhstan (Almaty) and Chinese Taipei (Taipei City) respectively.

We can also welcome the high level of the work program, the strong participation and extraordinary atmosphere of the FISU Forum held in 2012 in Taipei City. This forum is a unique meeting place for developing and sharing creativity and innovation, and is highly valued by all stakeholders whether they are students or executives.

One must not forget the World University Championships. Three of them took place in Asia in 2012: badminton (KOR), triathlon (TPE) and taekwondo (KOR). Asian countries have also actively taken part in the other WUCs that have taken place throughout the year. To date, the records show the participation of 854 athletes (569 men and 285 women) representing 89 delegations in the 2012 WUCs.

Associations also show great interest in FISU and university sport in general. At its latest ordinary general assembly in Shenzhen in 2011, FISU welcomed four new Asian member associations: Oman (OMA), Saudi Arabia (KSA), Singapore (SIN) and the Syrian Arab Republic (SYR). This brought the number of Asian FISU member associations up to 38. In addition, those associations are present at all levels of power within FISU with the involvement of many experts (16% in total, with 7 representatives in the Executive Committee).

No doubt, AUSF is a key partner for FISU. Through its action, it plays an essential role as a go-between with the associations of this vast continent. Let's express our gratitude to AUSF for that and encourage it to carry on contributing to the promotion of university sport hand in hand with FISU.

Chers amis,

C'est un plaisir et un honneur pour moi d'intervenir dans le superbe magazine de l'Asian University Sport Federation (AUSF).

Fondée en 1992 et membre associée de la FISU depuis 2007, l'AUSF fait preuve d'un dynamisme enthousiasmant dans le monde du sport universitaire international. Passant de 10 à 35 membres en 20 années d'existence, l'AUSF a su fédérer de plus en plus d'associations universitaires autour de son projet.

Il convient ici de rendre hommage au dynamisme du Président de l'AUSF, M. Zhang Xincheng (qui est aussi vice-Président de la FISU et Président de la FUSC). Sous son impulsion, de nombreuses actions ont pu être menées à bien et aujourd'hui l'AUSF peut s'enorgueillir de proposer un programme sportif très varié qui attire un nombre croissant de participants. Avec 6 championnats continentaux pour 2012 –Futsal, Taekwondo, Beach Volleyball, Basketball masculin, Waterpolo et Volleyball féminin, l'AUSF consolide chaque année un peu plus son programme (j'attends toujours les statistiques de participation en provenance de l'AUSF) tout en le doublant d'initiatives éducationnelles avec l'organisation récurrente de la « Conférence de l'AUSF ».

L'Asie est un continent très actif au sein de la FISU par le nombre de compétitions qui y sont organisées. On se souviendra, entre-autres, des trois Universiades organisées en 10 ans sous l'égide de la FUSC, à Beijing (Été 2001), à Harbin (Hiver 2009) et à Shenzhen (CHN-Été 2011), qui connurent un vif succès et ont valu à la FUSC de recevoir le Trophée de la meilleure fédération nationale du sport universitaire lors du Premier Gala de la FISU à Kazan.

Mais on pensera également à l'Universiade d'été de 2015 qui se tiendra à Gwangju (Corée) et aux Universiades d'hiver et d'été de 2017 qui seront organisées pour la première fois respectivement au Kazakhstan (Almaty) et en Chine Taipei (Taipei City). On peut aussi se féliciter du niveau élevé du programme de travail, de la très forte participation et de l'ambiance extraordinaire du Forum de la FISU organisé en 2012 à Taipei City. AUSF Executive Committee Meeting in Iran



AUSF Executive Committee held its first meeting of year 2012 in the glorious meeting meet of the Ministry of Science, Research and Technology. This meeting emphasized on 2 major issues, that is, the set-up of AUSF Calendar 2013 and preparation of AUSF General Assembly in the end of 2012. 12 Executive Committee members were present at the meeting, except for the Treasurer.

Mr. Mollabashi, the Ministry Councilor as the Representative of Minister made a welcome address. He expressed to the Executive Committee, on behalf of the Ministry and personally himself, his great appreciation for attributing the 3 events to Iran. He hoped that all the EC members could have a positive view on Iran.



During the meeting, the sub-region chairs made a report on the university sports development in each region. Through the reports, it was known that some regional activities were on the way, that good

As the last item of the Agenda, the redesign of AUSF logo and emblems were discussed. Mr. Choi, the Professor from Dankook University, invited by Vice President CHANG Hosung, redesigned the logo and emblems for AUSF, which was discussed by the EC members after several round of selection.

The 7th AUSF General Assembly was held in Cha Am, Thailand. 27 out of the 35 AUSF members participated in the meeting. During the meeting, the 20th anniversary of AUSF was celebrated. The special guests including FISU 1st Vice-President Oleg Matytsin, who was present on behalf of FISU President Claude-Louis Gallien, FISU Vice President Leonz Eder, EUSA President Mr. Adam Roczek and FASU delegate Mr. Jacob Stanley Nteere made the special trip to Cha Am for the celebration, bringing their congratulations on AUSF successful and rapid development.

On behalf of FISU, Mr. Matytsin highly praised AUSF under the leadership of President ZHANG Xincheng for fulfilling the responsibilities to integrate all Asian nations into one team, thanked AUSF for ever hosting 5 universiades in Asia and thanked Thailand for its contribution to AUSF & FISU sports movements. AUSF continued to perform well as one of the five continental federations affiliated to FISU. The outreaching and networking

The two flagship events of FISU in 2017 will be held in Asia. Almaty of Kazakhstan will host the Winter Universiade and Taipei City of Chinese Taipei will host the Summer Universiade. This is the first time in the history of FISU that these two events are held in Asia.

The attempts in Almaty and Tehran proved to be successful as the mega projects did attract a large number of attendance. Hosting of AUSF events also brought them honor and prestige thus creating better relationship of the NUSFs concerned with their universities and Governmental authorities.

Working Guidelines for Endorsement

The Secretariat worked diligently with EC members concerned especially with the Treasurer on some working guidelines and principles in order to facilitate proper working procedures and to enhance internal monitoring measures. The following were discussed and approved in principle by members of the Executive Committee and submitted for endorsement of the General Assembly 2012, these included:

- Regulations of Asian University Championships
- Evaluation of Asian University Championships
- Procurement and Purchasing Procedures
- Financial and Budget Policy
- Criteria for Appointment of Honorary Members
- Bidding Guidelines of Asian University Youth Festival (AUYF)
- Roles and Responsibilities for Sub-regional Chairs

The highlight of the meeting was on the part of Asia University Youth Festival, which was a comprehensive event for Asia students combining the sports activities, cultural performance and forum together. For a long time, AUSF members appealed that Asia should have its own University Games. After a long time thinking and consideration, the EC made the proposal to have the festival instead of the games, because we already have the world universiade in the odd year and some Asian sub-regions has its own sub-regional games in the even year, like ASEAN University Games. In the hope not to overburden the student athletes and provide them with the more diversified event, the EC submitted the proposal on AUYF, which was approved by the General Assembly. It was considered to have the 1st AUYF combined with the next General Assembly.

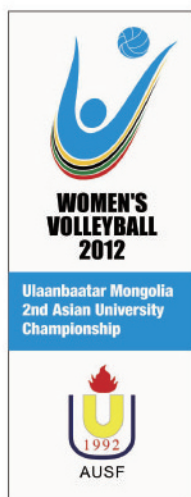
With the expectation to reach those unreachable, 35 AUSF members were divided into 5 sub-regions based on the geography and culture. The sub-regional chairs were nominated during the Kazakhstan EC meeting in 2011. During this GA, the sub-regional chairs were introduced to the members, which will facilitate the communication between the Secretariat and the members and make the communication more efficient. After the meeting, the 1st internal South Asian meeting was held.

Thanks to the contribution of AUSF Vice President Chang Hosung, AUSF has its new logo, which was approved by the members. The meeting ended productively and efficiently.



Women's Volleyball

The 2nd Asian University Women's Volleyball Championship was hosted by Mongolian Student Sports Federation and Mongolian Volleyball Association from 09 to 15 April 2012 in Ulaanbaatar, capital city of Mongolia. For this Championship, 75 student women volleyball players from 5 countries and regions including Hong Kong, Kyrgyzstan, Malaysia, Mongolia and Thailand, finally made their way to Mongolia.



At 17:00 on the afternoon of 9th April, the fantastic opening ceremony of the 2nd Asian University Women's Volleyball Championship was staged in Mongolian State Academic Theatre of Opera and Ballet with the Organizing committee members and many spectators present.

Mr. Kairat Zakiryanov, AUSF Auditor as the representative of AUSF President, Mr. Lambaa S., President of the Organizing Committee, Mr. Bayasgalan D., FISU Treasurer, Mr. Nishiwaki Yoshiharu, Sports Events Council Member of Asian Volleyball Confederation, Mr. Xu Hui, representative of AUSF and Mr. Jargalsaikhan D., AUSF Assessor were invited and attended the Opening Ceremony. Mr. Kairat Zakiryanov delivered a speech, expressing his gratitude to all the participants for their coming from

afar for this tournament, thanking Mongolian student sports federation and Government of Mongolia for their hospitality and great endeavor. He also wished all the participants best performance and wished this championship a great success.

The championship was in a Round-robin format and continued for seven days. Each team had one competition every day. After the training and competition, all of participants joined the cultural program and visited national museums of Mongolia.

Last day of the championship, Mongolia and Thailand team competed formidably for Gold medal when number of 6500 spectators saw the competition in Buyant-Ukhaa sports hall. Finally, Thailand team was awarded Gold medal as winning

Mongolian team. Mongolian girls were awarded Silver medal and Hong Kong, China team were awarded Bronze medal. At the closing ceremony, best players were awarded according to the statistic of the competition.

During the closing ceremony, Mr. Xu Hui, representative of AUSF said, Mongolia not only left the participants a good memory, but also made the youth strengthen our friendship. He hoped all students could be in a more vigorous vitality and vigor, constantly writing a new sports chapter of youth, friendship and harmony.

Futsal

Tehran hosted the 1st Asian Futsal Championship from 6th to 11th June. 139 participants from 8 AUSF members, including Hong Kong, Macao, China, Thailand, Syria, Oman, Iran (2 teams) and Kazakhstan took part in this championship. Opening ceremony was held at 7th June, in Olympic Hotel, while the first match was at 6th June. 18 matches were held in two groups: Group A including Iran A, Macao, Kazakhstan, Oman and China and Group B including Iran B, Thailand, Syria and Hong Kong. All matches were held in Allameh Tabatabaei University and Azad University venues. The championship was organized by Ministry of Sciences, Research and Technology of Iran and National University Sports Federation (NUSF).

In first day, 2 matches was held in Group A and Iran A and China won their rivals, respectively, Macao and Kazakhstan. The tournament was continued with 4 matches in second day, 7th June, From Group A Iran A vs. Kazakhstan, Oman vs. China and from Group B Iran B vs. Syria and Thailand vs. Hong Kong. The winners of this day were Iran A, Oman, Iran B and Thailand.

In the 3rd day, Iran A won against Oman and Kazakhstan won against Macao, in Group A, and in Group B,

Iran B and Thailand were the winners of the day, in the matches against Hong Kong and Syria, respectively.

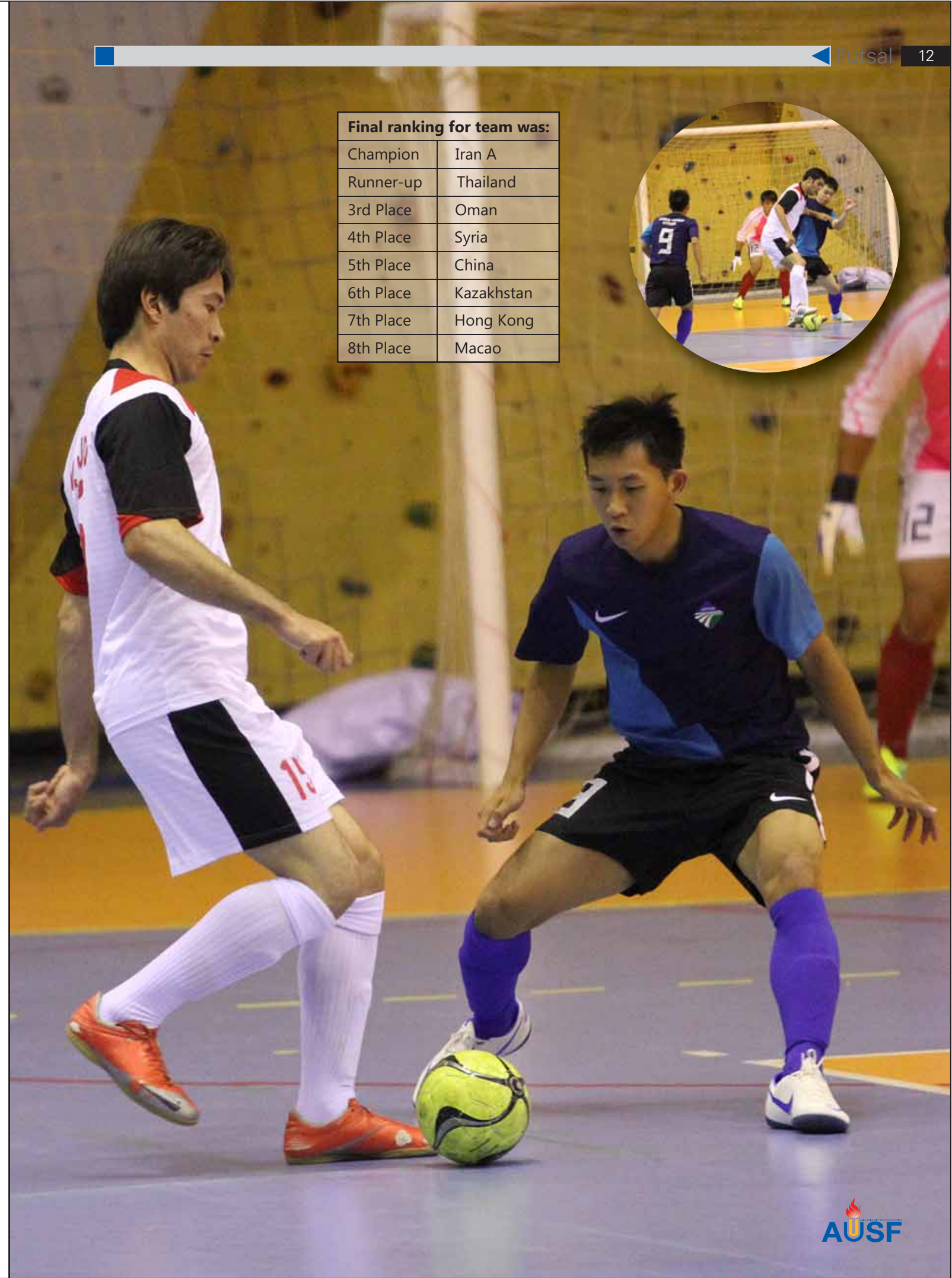
4th day included 4 matches: Syria vs. Hong Kong, Iran B vs. Thailand, China vs. Iran A and Macao vs. Oman. In the end of day, the winners were Syria, Iran B, Iran A and Oman. In 5th day, last 2 matches were done in Group A, Kazakhstan vs. Oman and China vs. Macao, that winners were Kazakhstan and China. Finally in 6th day of tournament, final and classification were held in Allameh Tabatabaei University venue. In final game Iran A won the 1st place, in a match against Iran B. Classification game were held between Thailand and Oman, that in this game Thailand won the 3rd place.

A great success in this event was cooperation of 60 volunteers, in organizing and operating activities, beside the operational team. This achievement represents high potential for managing and organizing sports events in Iran.

Water Polo

The 2nd Asian University Water Polo Championships was successfully hosted by the National University of Singapore (NUS), in partnership with the Singapore Swimming Association (Water Polo) from 14 to 19 June 2012. This was the second time for NUS to organize the tournament after its debut in 2010.

The seven teams which participated in the Championships were:

1. Universitas Negri Jakarta, Indonesia (UNJ)
2. Korean National Sports University, Korea (KNSU)
3. Malaysian University Sports Council, Malaysia (MUSC)
4. Federation of School Sports Association of the Philippines, Philippines (FESSAP)
5. Kasetsart University, Thailand (KU)
6. National University of Singapore, Singapore (NUS)
7. Nanyang Technological University, Singapore (NTU)

Other than host NUS, defending champions KNSU and local university NTU, all other teams were participating in the tournament for the first time. Their excitement and eagerness start the championships could be seen from their enthusiasm at the AUWP Opening Ceremony. Besides the medal winners, individual awards were also presented to Top Scorer - Yun Youngwan, Korea, Top Goalkeeper - Lee Sanghyup, Korea and the Most Valuable Player: Koh Jian Ying, NUS. All individual prizes were kindly sponsored by Turbo ES Asia. Moreover, the closing ceremony was also made sweeter when KNSU announced that they would be hosting the next Asian University Water Polo Championships in 2014!

However, the championships did not end there. All the participants were treated to a day of fun and relaxation at Universal Studios Singapore before returning to their respective home countries. For

many of the athletes, this was their first time in Singapore and they were clearly enthused for the treat at USS!

With that, the 2nd AUWP was finally concluded with very satisfied participants. Mr. Soh Yew Siang, from the Malaysian team had this to say, "Our Team had a great outing and experience and we look forward to many more opportunities for such competitions that helps to promote the sport, interaction, friendship and understanding. We wish to also thank all our friends from all the other

participating teams with whom we had very many challenging matches and games and the knowledge and experience that we had gained is indeed invaluable."

Indeed, the friendships forged and the memories created at such a tournament were more valuable than the competition itself. Congratulations to NUS for hosting yet another successful tournament and look forward to AUWP 2014 in Korea!

Taekwondo

Asian University Taekwondo Championship (AUTC) is one of the prestigious tournament represented by various countries. The tournament was held in the United Arab Emirates (UAE) for the first time in 2010. In 2011, Kazakhstan was given the opportunity to become the host. This year, Malaysia has been given the honour to hold this esteemed tournament.

Universiti Malaysia Sabah has been entrusted by the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) and Malaysia University Sports Council (MASUM) to host this 3rd Asian University Taekwondo Championships starting from 11th to 13th October 2012. This tournament was participated by nine countries comprising of China, Philippines, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Nepal, Thailand, Vietnam, Singapore and Malaysia as the host nation during the tournament.

This championship battle for both men and women consisted of 11 categories Kyorugi (sparring) and three categories Poomsee (pattern). Kyorugi category consists of Fin Weight, Weight Fly, Bantam Weight, Feather Weight, Light Weight, Welter Weight, Middle Weight and Heavy Weight whereas Poomsee category consists of individual, team (third team) and mixed couples.



Opening Ceremony was officiated by the Deputy Secretary General Malaysia Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE), Datuk Haji Omar Abdul Rahman at Universiti Malaysia Sabah, Chancellor Hall.

Thailand emerged as overall champion after winning seven gold medals, two silver and one bronze.

Kazakhstan ranked second best with three gold, one silver and two bronze medals, followed by Vietnam in third.

They also won three gold medals and one silver medal, but lost to Kazakhstan

in the bronze medal. They only managed to win a bronze.

China is also the winner of two gold medals under their belt to eventually finished fourth overall, while in the Philippines in the fifth with one gold, one silver and three bronze medals. Malaysia's sixth best overall.

Also present during the closing ceremony of the championship was the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Student Affairs and Alumni), and Chairman of MASUM, Associate Professor Datuk Dr. Kasim Hj Md Mansur.

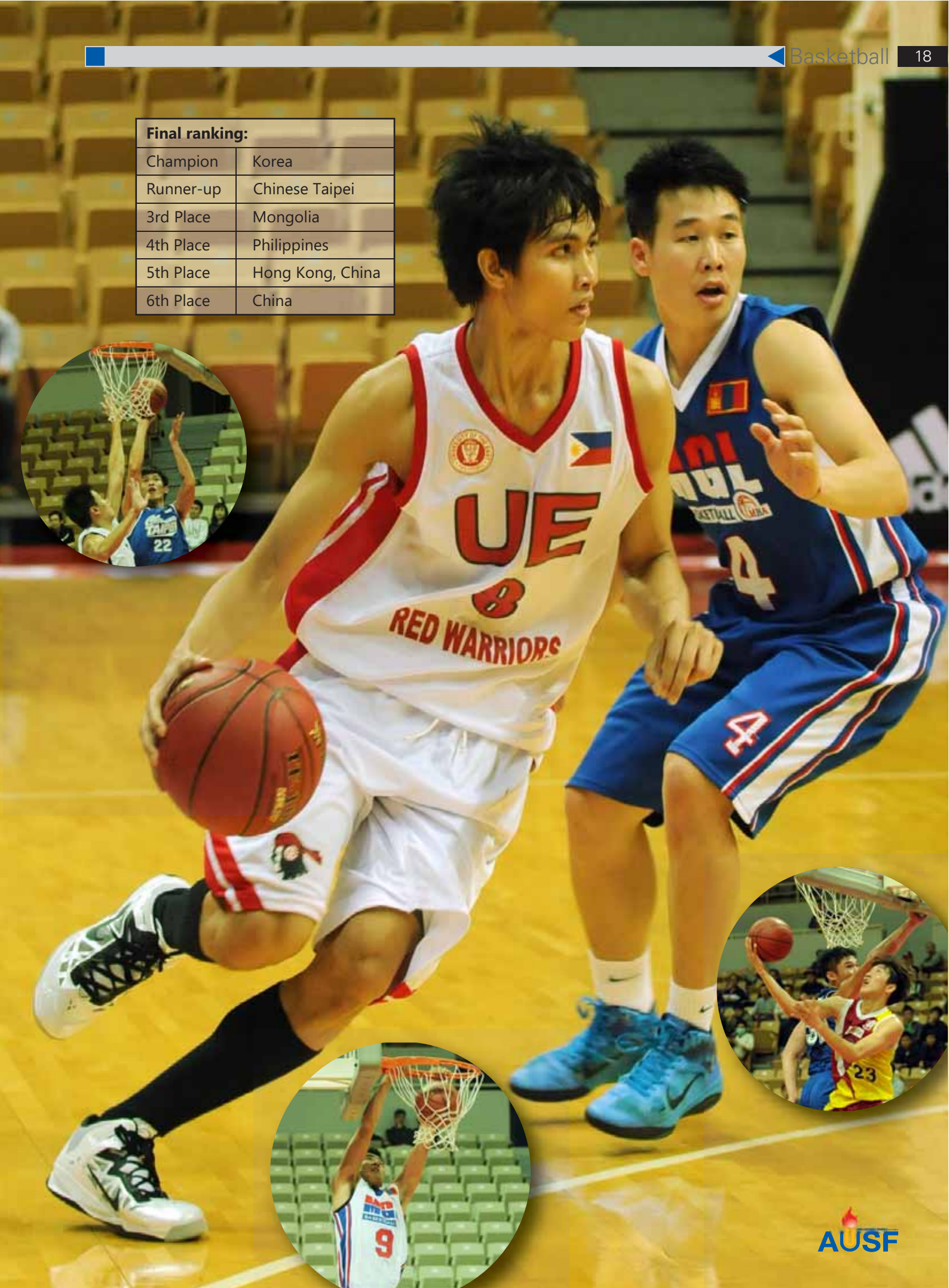

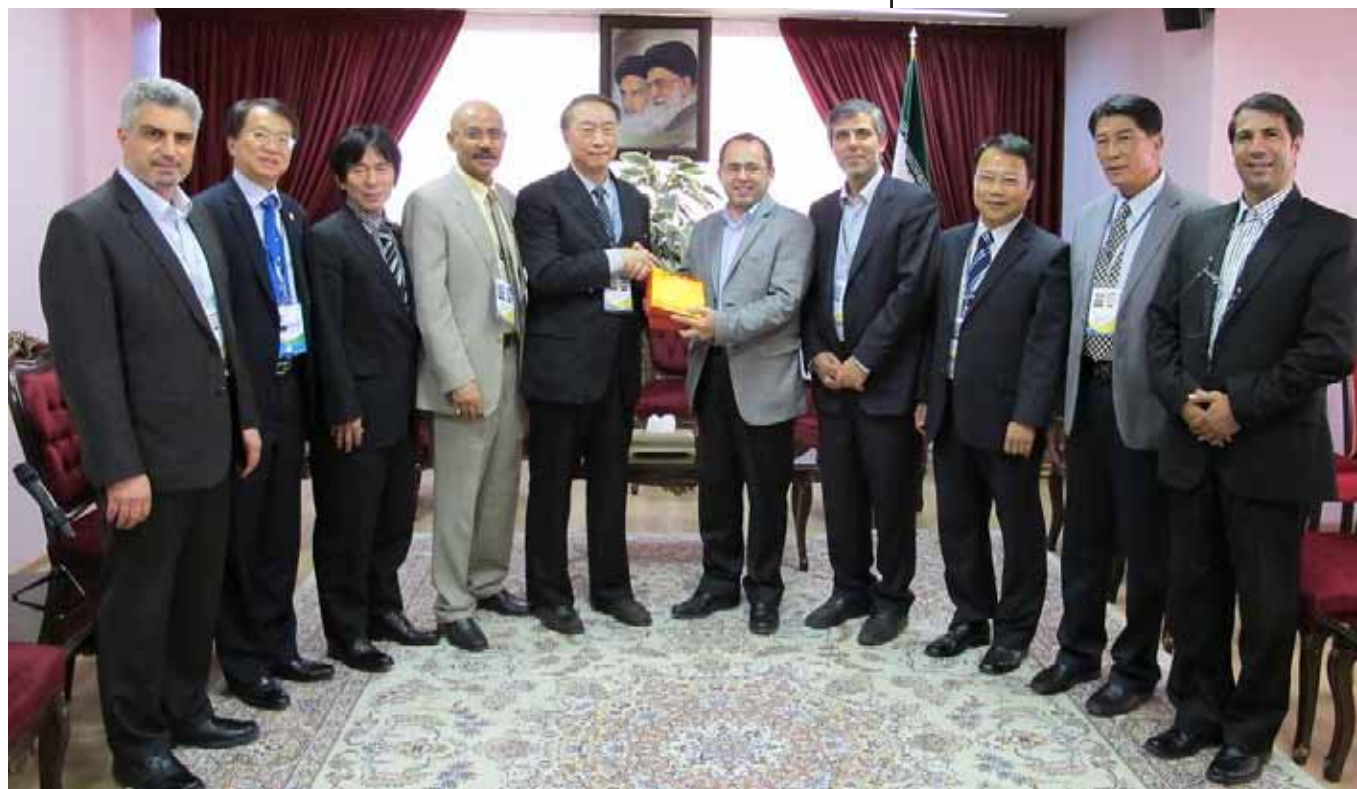

The 2nd day started with 3 training workshops, at the same time:

- 1- Volunteerism and University Sport Association
- 2- NAIA, NIA, Varsity Sport within Universities
- 3- Role of Sport Events in Preserving National and International Culture

This day continued by 29 oral lectures in 2 topics, which were held in 2 separated halls, at the same time. The main topics were:

- 1- Importance of Asian University Sport Programs
- 2- Sports Medicine

In this day, a review and theorizing meeting on "Opportunities and Threats in University Sports" was organized that provided a rich environment for scientific arguments on university sports.

Finally, in the end of 2nd day, closing ceremony was held in Olympic Hotel.

Vast variety in lecture topics and scientific enrichment were the most important achievements in this conference. Each of submitted articles was reviewed by 3 scientific board members as mentioned by President of NUSF, Mr. Mahdi Talebpour, which supported integrity of scientific contents of conference.





16th ASEAN University Games



Thousands of university students from 11 countries came together in Laos' capital of Vientiane to take part in the 16th ASEAN University Games (AUG), which was held around Vientiane from 12 to 20 Dec. 2013.

It was the first time that the biannual AUG was hosted by Laos since it began in 1981. The last games were held in Thailand in 2010. Laos first joined the games in 2006.

Teams of university students from 10 ASEAN member nations, including Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam and Laos, have been competing in Laos' capital of Vientiane over the last nine days to win glory for their home country. Timor Leste, who are presently in the process of applying for ASEAN membership, also took part.



At this year's event, students competed in 17 sports, including aquatics, athletics, archery, basketball, badminton, various martial arts, table tennis, tennis, and football.

The opening ceremony, held in Laos' National Stadium, featured a torch relay, cultural performances, and an athlete's parade. The Lao Prime Minister Thongsing Thammavong attended the ceremony and officially opened the games.

"It is indeed a great privilege for our university and teaching staff and students to host such a grand regional event for the first time," said Lao Minister for Education and Sports Phankham Viphavanh while addressing the ceremony.

The theme of the 16th AUG was 'We are ASEAN family'. "The competition aims at creating goodwill, spiritual solidarity, amity and peace among student athletes," Viphavanh said.



During the event Laos scored 32 gold medals, substantially higher than their original goal of 10. Overall Malaysia scored the most gold medals with 60, followed by Vietnam with 56, Thailand with 45, and Indonesia with 41.

ASEAN nations expressed their appreciation and congratulations at the success of Laos' hosting of the

event. "Every day, we've received compliments from the heads of visiting athlete delegations. They told us they enjoyed staying here and eating the food we provided, and they also enjoyed the general atmosphere of the games," said Vice-President of Games Organising Committee Soukkongseng Saignaleuth.

The opening and closing ceremonies together cost Laos \$900,000. During the closing ceremony the audience was treated to three programs of song and dance from local students. Once the Lao portion of the ceremony was completed, Indonesia performers were invited to the arena. That was because the 17th AUG would be held in Indonesia.



Asean University Sports Council International Conference 2012

In collaboration with Ministry of Higher Education Malaysia (MOHE), Malaysian University Sports Council (MASUM), Universiti Teknologi MARA (UiTM) and National University of Laos (NUOL), a 2-day international sports conference was held at Don Chan Palace Hotel & Convention, Vientiane, Lao PDR, in conjunction with the 16th ASEAN University Games (AUG) on the 13th – 14th December 2012.

The ASEAN University Sports Council (AUSC) provided a platform for all stakeholders involved planning sports and exercise around region to deliberate on "Current Development & Challenges in Sport". This was intended to bring about greater awareness of sports and exercise to all stakeholders (government, industry, professional organizations, consumer bodies and the public). It is a call for all stakeholders to collaborate in promoting sports in the region.

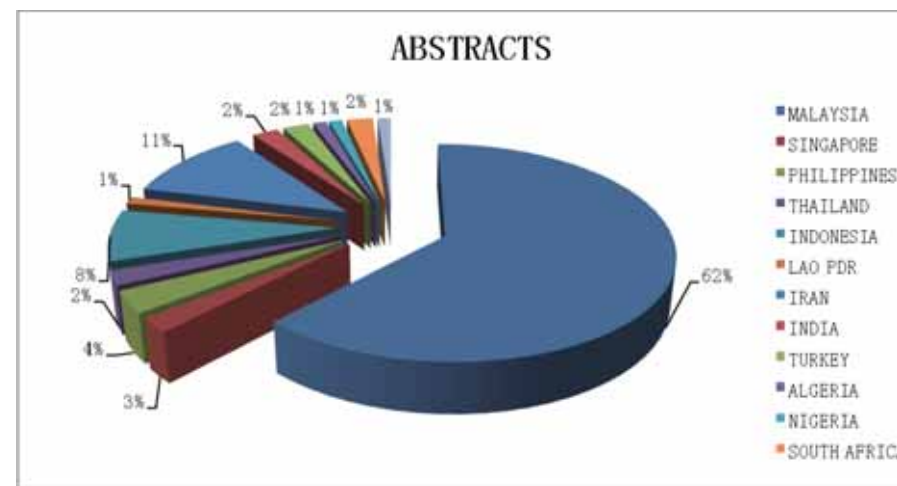
1. Sports Management

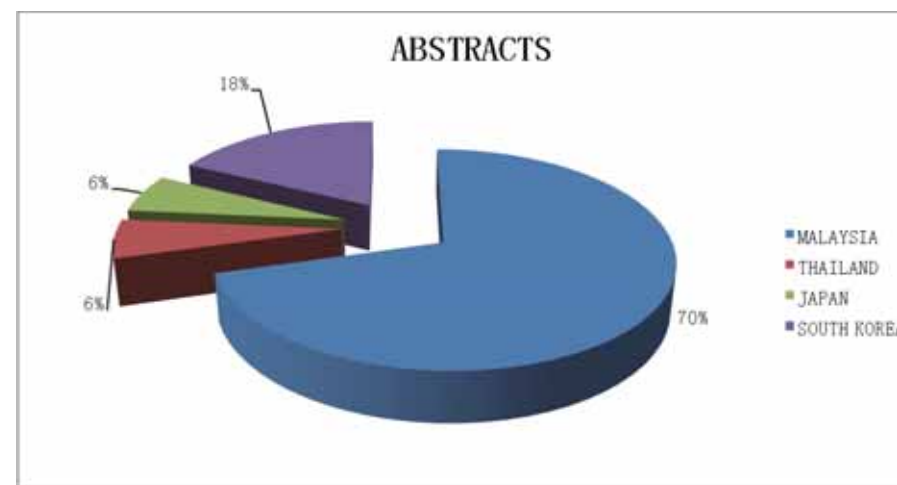

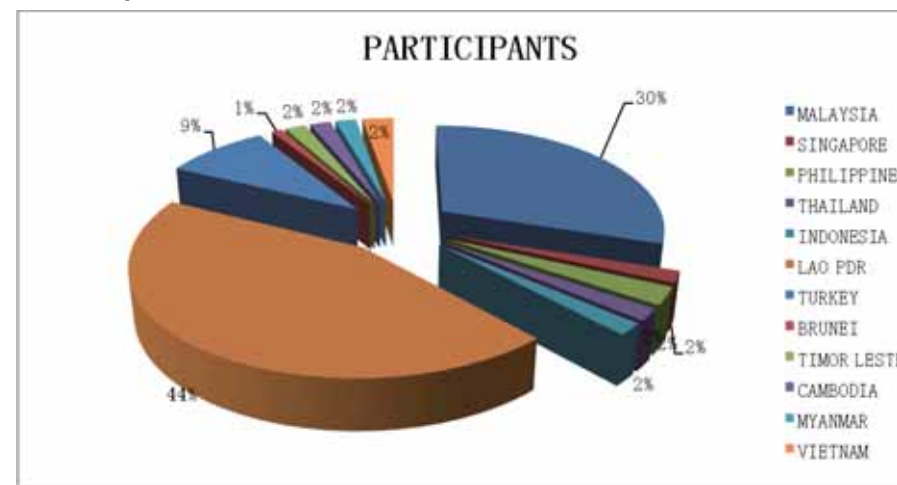

To Be the One through Sports on the Joint Project between UNOSDP and Gwangju Universiade 2015

Promote the First Ever United Korean Team, the EPIC Speaker Program, and the Host of the Youth Leadership Camp.

The Gwangju Summer Universiade 2015 (hereafter GU 2015) has been attracted more and more attention and interests by the joint project with the United Nations Office on Sport for Development and Peace (UNOSDP) to make greater values realize beyond sports. Last July, the UNOSDP made the agreement with the host city of sporting event for the first time in its history embracing the huge interest to establish the peaceful atmosphere by the means of sport. The joint project between the UNOSDP and the GU 2015 is going to be preceded actively with the programs upon the Inter-Korean Sports Exchanges, EPIC Speaker Program, and the Youth Leadership Camp.

Arrangement of the United Korean Team

The first time ever try to arrange the united Korean team in the multi-sport event is now on the process by careful arbitrating of the UNOSDP. Currently the North and South Korea have been deserted with scarce political, military and cultural interchanges since the Korean War in 1950. Even in that situation, the united Korean team during the 1991 World Table Tennis Championships in Chiba, Japan beat the world's strongest Chinese team. Then exactly 20 years later, at the 1st Peace and Sports Cup which was held in Doha, Qatar, the united Korean team derived good result once again.

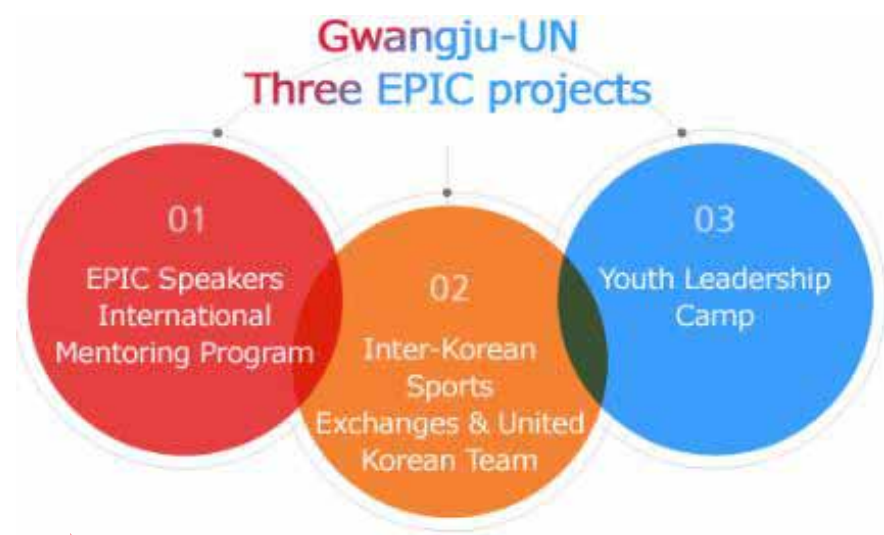
Through those procedures, the North and South Korea could open the sluice and keep up the mood of

reconciliation again. The GU 2015 with the positive energy hopes to reproduce the glory in 2015 once more. The GU 2015 targets to arrange at least more than two joint athletes' teams to march together, and cheering squads, journalists, as well as cultural exchanges etc to expand the events as a youth festival.

EPIC Speaker Program

The second joint project is the EPIC Speaker Program which stands for the 5 scopes in eco-friendly, peace, IT, culture, and sports development with the purpose of encouraging the world's youth by the appointed global leaders as the youths' mentors...

The EPIC and the sports development as for the concept of the GU2015 aim to help the constant realization of sports spirit via communicating with the 5 worlds' leaders from each field. The GU 2015 is preparing for the eco-friendly sporting event to regenerate the beauty of city and nature under the ideas of the EPIC. The effect on recycling central city has been maximized by constructing only 2 stadiums among 73 venues as utilizing the existing facilities to full capacity and by reconstructing the old city apartments into the athletes' town.



The GU 2015 is promoting the inter-Korean sports exchanges for human rights in peace and the measures to support participations from extremely poor countries as well as producing anti-doping instructions. The Republic of Korea as the powerful country in Information Technology is trying to realize the best game scores and optimum game operations via the comprehensive game operating system adapted the cutting-edge technology for sports games. In the respect of the national government, the city of Gwangju which is promoting the project on the Asian core cultural city will be making the youths from all over the world as the one through various social and cultural events.

The EPIC Speaker Program is to have the online conversations together with the worlds' youth on the EPIC website, and to invite the celebrities in each major field to the Forum held in Korea.

Youth Leadership Camp

The Youth Leadership Camp (YLC) has been designed to encourage the youth from developing countries to be the future leaders and to cultivate their sociability and leadership by the means of sports.

The YLC which will be the first hosting in Gwangju upcoming August is going to be held every year until 2015 and it is expected to be more meaningful if the North Korean youths can take part in the event.

The GU 2015 in approaching around 2 years time holds other tasks to keep promoting as well. The 2013 Kazan Universiade in Russia is taking



place this summer and the Trentino Winter Universiade in Italy is scheduled upcoming December. Gwangju will be taking over the game flag from the Kazan Universiade upcoming July in the participation as the next game host. Taking over of the game flag implies several meanings. We could feel that the GU 2015 is now 2 years ahead as well as needing spur up to make the complete preparation in every aspect, bucking down to showing internationally that the next event is for the Gwangju City.

There is the reason why Gwangju is trying so hard to foster more volunteers. It is based on the

determination that the practical operators for the GU 2015 would be the volunteers who can greet and guide the visitors from over 170 countries. We are planning to train the number of 120,000 volunteers this year by running the permanent education programs working with universities, Office of Education, and local volunteer centers. We will be boosting the citizen participation and preparing for the event with them until then.

The athletes' town and the game venues as for the crucial infrastructure have been approved by the national government last year, and the facilities are going to



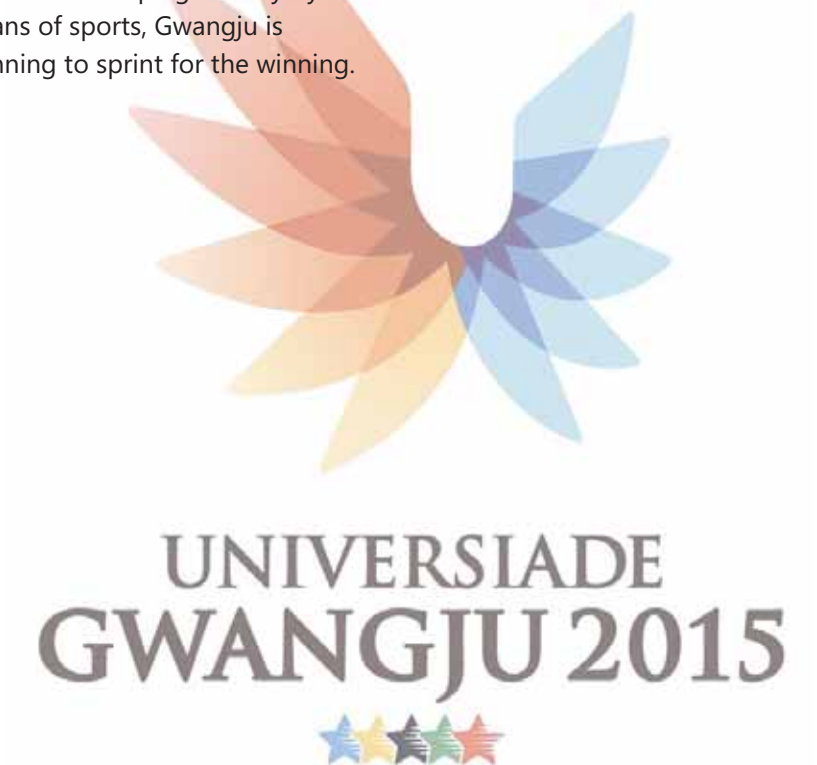


be started building this year. Particularly, the athletes' town which has received global attention as adapting the way of reconstruction at the first time for the international games is currently under construction without any problems. The newly built and renovated stadiums will be made over as the world-class ones in 2 years by the construction plan.

Gwangju also has the aim to certainly win the bid for the 2019 World Swimming Championships promoting the post-Universiade. The bidding for the 2019 World Swimming Championships is to utilize the facilities after the Universiade and create continuous



economic feasibility and furthermore, to perform the strategy on the dream city of sports which refers to developing the city by the means of sports, Gwangju is planning to sprint for the winning.

The Summer months, the WUC activity was in full swing with no less than 16 World University Championships taking place since the last update.

The Czechs dominated the 21st World University Handball Championship in Blumenau (SC), Brazil, taking the gold in the men's and women's competitions. The French dominated the 11th WUC Triathlon in Yilan County (TPE) where the gold medal of the men's race went to French triathlete André Thomas, whose teammate Felix Duchamp won the silver. Lukas Kocar, a nineteen-year-old Czech athlete was the winner of the bronze medal. In the women's race, the first triathlete to cross the finish line was Alex Cassan Ferrter from France, followed by Yoko Takahashi from Japan, while Diaz Gomez from Mexico ranked third. At the 4th WUC Golf in Liberec, the University golf players from Spain won in all categories. The Men's competition was dominated by Pigem Xammar Carlos, with a total result of 270 shots. Second placed was David Booth (GBR) with the result of 273, together with Juan Sarasti Bernarase (ESP). In the women's competition Camila Hedberg Bertrand (ESP) won masterfully, in front of the Americans Amy Anderson and Caroline Powers. The Spanish also dominated the team competition winning the gold in the men's and women's team tournament. At the 18th WUC Orienteering in Alicante (ESP), the Swedish women and Swiss men dominated the medal podiums. With 7 medals (5 gold, 1 silver & 1 bronze), the Koreans dominated the 9th WUC Archery



that took place in Córdoba (ESP). The Koreans are trailed by the Americans with 6 medals (3-2-1) and Chinese Taipei with 4 (0-2-2) and host Spain with 3 medals (0-1-2). At the inaugural WUC Basketball 3X3 in Kragujevac (SRB) Italy (W) and host Serbia (M) won the gold. In Reims, at the 6th WUC Bridge, Team Poland has won its third World University Bridge Championship, after 2004 and 2010. Both women's and men's teams of Great Britain won the gold at the 5th World University Rugby 7 Championship in Brive, France. Ukraine (M) and Brazil (W) won the gold at the 13th WUC Futsal in Braga (POR), while the 12th WUC Chess, hosted in neighboring city Guimarães, was dominated

by the Chinese student-chess players. Host Germany ruled the podium at the 10th WUC Equestrian in Aachen. The German riders took the gold in dressage, in the team combined competition and in the individual combined competition. In Nice (FRA) the crews from Australia (M) and Brazil (W) dominated the podium both winning gold and silver. The bronze medals for women and men went to France and Great Britain respectively. At the 6th WUC Beach Volleyball, held in Maceió (BRA), Ross/Day (W/USA) and Dollinger/Schröder (M/GER) won the gold. Three WUC took place in Kazan, host of the 2013 SU. Poland, winning eight golds, 4 silvers and two bronzes topped

the medal table of the 5th WUC Canoe Sprint followed by host Russia. After five days of competition at the 4th WUC Shooting Sport, host Russia topped the medal tally with a total of 17 medals (11 golds, 4 silvers and 2 bronzes). The French shooters earned 12 medals (4 golds, 5 silvers and 3 bronzes) and finished second on the medal table. South Korea got 11 (4 silvers, 6 bronzes and one bronze) and sits in the third place. At the 12th WUC Rowing, Team Germany topped the overall team standings with three gold medals. The Italian national team took home two golds, two silvers and one bronze. Russia slipped into the third position with one bronze, two silvers and one bronze.

FISU Meetings

Not only sporting action could be spotted in Kazan. On September 20th, the FISU Executive Board met in Kazan. The next day, the FISU Extraordinary General Assembly took place at the Korston Mall and Hotel in Kazan. The main goal of this Extraordinary General Assembly was to introduce amendments to the FISU Constitution. On September 22nd, FISU celebrated its Gala Night in Kazan to honor a number of personalities and organizations who contributed to the popularity of the International University Sport Movement. For the future hosts of the Universiades it was an opportunity to showcase their city.

London Olympics

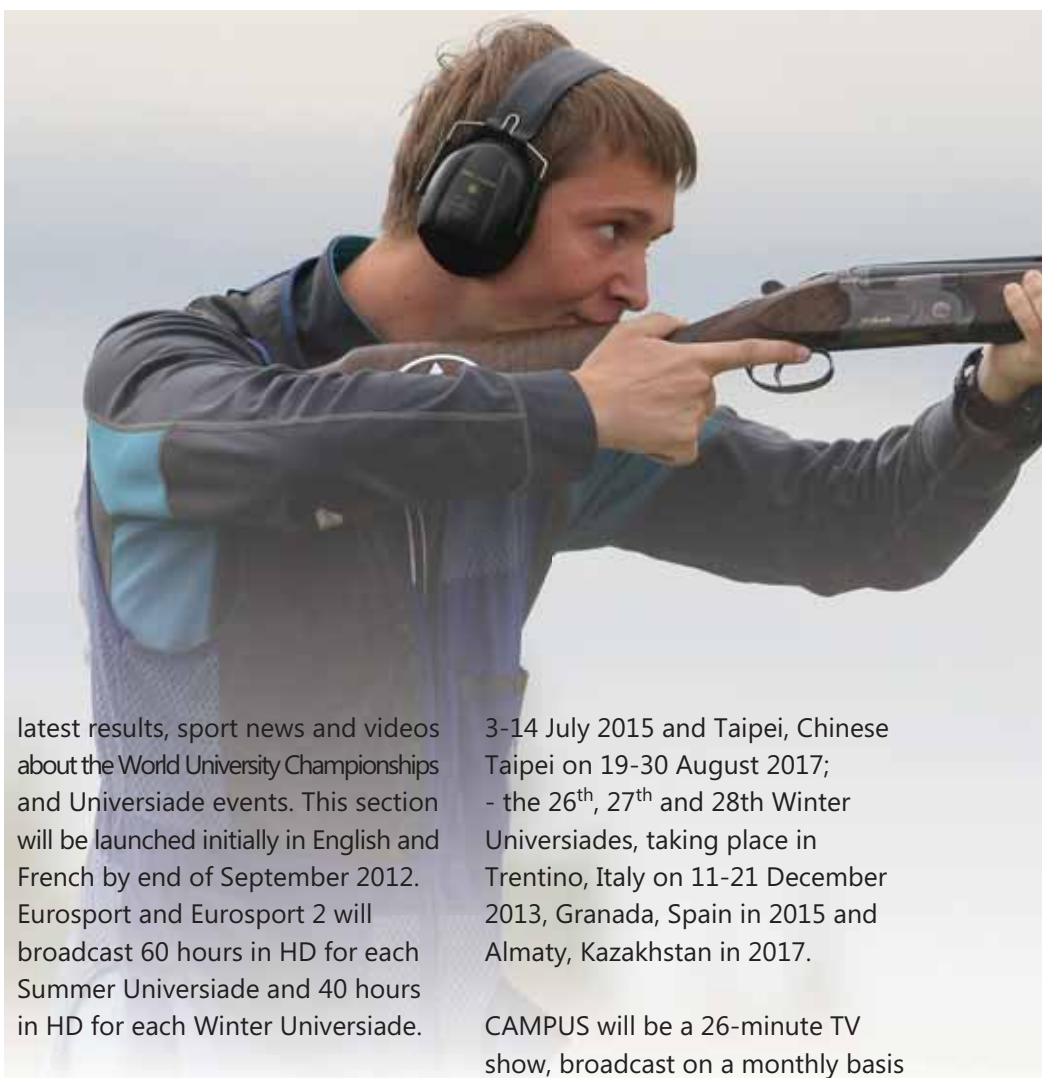
Plenty of familiar FISU faces at the Olympic Games in London last August. Indeed, not only did we see a record number of former Universiade/WUC participants mounting the Olympic medal podium, but also FISU/AIPS Young Reporters joined the media army to report on the Games. In London a record number of former FISU athletes pocketed Olympic brass. Indeed, no less than 154 athletes – 75 men and 79 women – conquered an amazing 174 Olympic medals: 48 gold, 56 silver and 70 bronze. And this in 21 of the 26 sports on the Olympic programme, i.e. archery, athletics, badminton, basketball, boxing, canoe-kayak, cycling, diving, equestrian, fencing, football, gymnastics, judo, rowing, shooting



sport, swimming, taekwondo, water polo, weightlifting and wrestling. This is the best result so far of former student-athletes who continue to grow in their sports career after participating in a FISU event. We stress the fact that these numbers only reflect the medal winners at the London Olympics, the number of former student-athletes participating in the London Games is far more higher.

Eurosport

The Eurosport Group and FISU have signed a six-year agreement, starting in September 2012. This long-term partnership will give the Summer and Winter Universiades - FISU's highly successful global multi-sport events - comprehensive television coverage on an international basis across Eurosport's unrivalled pan-European network. Eurosport will also produce a monthly TV show called CAMPUS dedicated to the World University Championship events and FISU's global commitment to excellence in body and mind. The multi-media partnership is completed with the creation of a dedicated university sports section on Eurosport.com which will include the



latest results, sport news and videos about the World University Championships and Universiade events. This section will be launched initially in English and French by end of September 2012. Eurosport and Eurosport 2 will broadcast 60 hours in HD for each Summer Universiade and 40 hours in HD for each Winter Universiade.

The deal with FISU includes TV broadcast in Europe of:
- the 27th, 28th and 29th Summer Universiades, held in Kazan, Russia on 6-17 July 2013, Gwanju, Korea on

3-14 July 2015 and Taipei, Chinese Taipei on 19-30 August 2017;
- the 26th, 27th and 28th Winter Universiades, taking place in Trentino, Italy on 11-21 December 2013, Granada, Spain in 2015 and Almaty, Kazakhstan in 2017.

CAMPUS will be a 26-minute TV show, broadcast on a monthly basis until December 2017. The program will cover the World University Championships, organized by FISU and follow preparations for the Universiades, feature profiles and

interviews with the Universiade athletes and explain FISU's values and university spirit. CAMPUS went on air for the first time on Eurosport on 26 September at 21:00 CET. It included a special focus on the FISU Gala in Kazan which took place on 22 September.



FISU President Claude-Louis Gallien commented: "I am extremely pleased that FISU has signed a multi-year partnership with Eurosport for our upcoming events. Like FISU, which strives for Excellence on the academic campus and on the sports field, Eurosport has been pursuing excellence in bringing the major international sports events in the homes of many sports fans. I am confident that with the help of Eurosport the International University Sport Movement will continue to grow in popularity worldwide."



Laurent-Eric Le Lay, Eurosport Chairman & CEO said: "We are delighted to have this opportunity to bring Eurosport's unrivalled expertise and multi-media credentials to this long-term partnership with FISU, which will enable fans to follow the upcoming athletes of the future. We are committed to being the first to showcase the best young rising stars in sport as we do with football for example with the NextGen Series and other international youth competitions. We are looking forward to developing a strong relationship with FISU which will give a platform to its highly respected events, commercial partners and key messages. Eurosport is committed to ensuring action from the Universiades and its associated events are accessible to sports fans across Europe."

European University Sports Association – EUSA

The European University Sports Association (EUSA) was founded on November 13, 1999 in Vienna, Austria. Delegates from 25 National University Sports Associations from Europe gathered in the Austrian Capital City and signed the declaration on foundation. From the foundation until this year's General Assembly, the number of member federations has been steadily rising, and today EUSA counts 45 member associations from all over Europe, and is recognised as the Continental university sports entity by the International University Sports Federation (FISU). The Association has its legal seat at Zurich (SUI) and the Secretariat in Ljubljana (SLO).

EUSA, governed by the General Assembly and the representatives of member associations as the body of highest authority, is represented by the Executive Committee, chaired by its President. The Executive Committee is composed of 13 voting members including the President, the two Vice-Presidents and the Treasurer, and assisted by the Secretary General. The activities of the organisation are carried out also by the Secretariat and with the help of Commissions and Working Groups; like the Technical Commission, Student Commission, Medical Commission, Media and Communications Commission, etc.

The focus of EUSA activities consists of sports events, educational events, projects, advocacy, promotion and other activities.

Sports events:

- European Universities Championships
- European Universities Games
- EUSA Cups and Patronage

Educational events:

- Conferences
- Convention
- Symposium

Projects:

- Own: volunteer training, photo competition, gender equality initiative

- As partners: European anti-doping initiative, Prevention of sexualised violence in sports

European Universities Championships (EUC) are university sports competitions governed by EUSA. There are currently 17 sports in which the championships are organised: Badminton, Basketball, Basketball 3x3, Beach-Volleyball, Bridge, Football, Futsal, Golf, Handball, Judo, Karate, Rowing, Rugby 7's, Table Tennis, Taekwondo, Tennis and Volleyball. Participants in these events are European university teams and individuals, representing primarily their home universities. The championships have been organised annually since 2001, starting with two sports, and from 2012 onwards, they are organised on a biannual basis, with European Universities Games being organised in odd years as a multi-sport events, and the individual championships being organised in even years.

European Universities Games (EUG/EUSA Games) is a new concept of EUSA, with the first edition organised in Cordoba, Spain between July 13 and 23, 2012. The EUSA Games are a multi-sport university sports competition, consisting of 8 compulsory and two optional sports. Success of the event was not just in numbers, but also in the experiences,

opportunities and cooperation of the participants. Thanks to the dedication of the organisers, with His Majesty, the King Juan Carlos I as the honorary president of the Organising Committee and strong support of the University of Cordoba, the city, region and the government, assisted by partners and sponsors and due to the engagement of local and international volunteers, the first EUSA Games were truly memorable, and set a benchmark for further events.

At the 1st edition of the EUSA Games, participants were able to compete with their peers in 12 days of competitions, with 677 matches altogether, and in the end the European Universities Games Champions were declared. EUSA Games brought much more than just sports competitions, with plenty of educational, cultural, socialising and networking events, opportunities...

With over 2500 participants, EUSA Games were one of the largest sports events in Europe in 2012 along with the London Olympic Games and the Winter Youth

Olympic Games in Innsbruck. The 2nd edition of the Games has already been attributed, and will take place in Rotterdam, the Netherlands in 2014.

For the organisers of EUSA-licensed sporting events, Conventions for the organisers of the European Universities Games and European Universities Championships are organised. In 2012, two such events were organised. First the EUSA Games Convention in Cordoba, Spain hosted the event between January 13 and 15, 2012. The convention was a chance for EUSA Technical Delegates and staff to meet and discuss various aspects of the 1st European Universities Games together with the Organising Committee representatives and sports managers of the EUSA Games which were then held July 13-23, 2012 in the same city.

Portoroz, Slovenia hosted the EUSA Convention for the organisers of the European Universities Championships 2013 between November 16 and 18, 2012. The convention started with the meeting of the newly-appointed Technical Commission on Friday.

During the event, over 60 participants got acquainted with the structure of the organisation, its activities and history, with the most important past and future milestones. Rules and regulations, governing the sports events – European Universities Championships and European Universities Games were presented, along with the presentation of best practice and other useful advice and guidelines for organisation of successful events. Special focus was also given to the fields of volunteering, registration and accreditation, medical, hygiene and catering aspects of the events and other important topics. All organisers also presented their events, and had individual workshops with the technical delegates.

2012 was important for EUSA also because of statutory changes, with the electoral General Assembly being organised in Maribor, Slovenia between March 15 and 18, 2013. Mr Adam Roczek from Poland was elected as the new President of EUSA for the next 4-year mandate, with other members of the Executive Committee were elected as well. Two new organisations/countries joined EUSA (Armenia and Liechtenstein), totalling the number of members to 45.

As part of the Assembly, EUSA Conference entitled Embracing University Sport was organised in Maribor on March 16, 2012. The theme of the conference were the different aspects of university sport, with the focus on Europe, and the necessity to also focus on matters beyond sport itself, thus embracing the whole spectrum of the student sport sphere.

The first panel was the European Policies on Sport, with invited

organisations European Athlete as Student Network – EAS European Network of Academic Sports Services – ENAS. The second panel was devoted to the European Universities Games, a new multi-sport student event, governed by EUSA. Representatives of the Organising Committees of the 1st European Universities Games in 2012 - Cordoba, Spain and of the 2nd European Universities Games in 2014 - Rotterdam, the Netherlands presented the projects.

The next panel was devoted to the European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn). ENGSO Youth President opened the session, giving some background information about the project, its roots and future continuations. The floor was given then to EUSA representatives involved in the project for an overall review of the activities taking place in the project within the scope of EUSA. After a break the President of the NUSA of the hosting country Slovenia presented the overview of the 15 years of the Slovenian University Sports Association and mentioned the successes but also the challenges that SUSA is facing. In the panel Sport and Cultural Events representatives of the member federations presented their projects and initiatives.

The final panel of the conference was the topic of Women in Sport. The Opening Speech was given by the Winner of the 2012 IOC Women and Sport Trophy for Africa, stressing the importance of active inclusion of women in sport, not just on symbolic, but also on practical level. The latest numbers of the participation in EUSA events

according to gender were presented by the EUSA Gender Equality working group, giving also an overview of the activities which have been undertaken by EUSA in the field of Gender Equality and active involvement of women in sport. The conference concluded with the official signing of the Brighton Declaration on Women and Sport.

IOC recognized the work of our own Mrs. Peninnah Aligawesa Kabenge in promoting Women and Sport worldwide by awarding her the 2012 accolade for Africa.

Peninnah, a FISU Assessor, Secretary General of FASU and the President of the National University Sports Federation of Uganda received the award on 16th February 2012 at the opening ceremony of the 5th IOC World Conference on Women and Sport at J.W. Marriott Hotel in Los Angeles – California USA from Mr. Antonio Villaraigosa, Mayor of Los Angeles. Peninnah was introduced for the award by Nicole Hoevertsz (IOC Women and Sport Commission and IOC Member) who read her biography to the world.

Peninnah becomes the first member of the FASU Executive to be honored by IOC.

"I am grateful that IOC has honored my efforts in promoting sport amongst the girl child and the women of Africa, and the world at large. This award does not mean I have arrived. It is just an honour. We shall not rest until we have achieved the level we believe women should be at in active and passive sports participation." Said Peninnah.

THE 1ST EAST AFRICA UNIVERSITY FEMALE GAMES SUCCESSFULLY END AT MAKERERE UNIVERSITY KAMPALA

Female students and officials from universities in the East African region converged at Makerere University in Kampala – Uganda to participate in the 1st Edition of the 1st East Africa University Female Games. The games are aimed at promoting and celebrating women involvement in University Sports (Especially those marginalized sports).

The event attracted participants from Kenya and Uganda with a total of 880 participants from 10 Universities including; Moi University, Makerere University, Makerere University Business School, Kampala University, Kampala International University,

Ndejje University, St Lawrence University, Islamic University In Uganda, Uganda Christian University and Mbarara University of Science and Technology.

The games were organized, run and officiated by women in a bid to promote more women in all sectors of sports. Athletes competed in Handball, Football, Netball, Tennis and Chess. All officiating officials were women apart from a few delegation officials who were men.

In his words, the President of the East Africa University Sports Federation, Mr. Cyriaco Kabagambe thanked FISU, through FASU for funding this great dream which had become a reality. He informed guest that this was just the beginning of a long

project until it shall become a great celebration of women in sport in the whole East African region.

FASU EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETS IN ENTEBBE - UGANDA

Expectations were high as members of the FASU Executive Board converged in the city of Entebbe in Uganda for an executive committee meeting for the year 2012.

The program, which ran from Friday 31st August to Monday 3rd September 2012, was expected to address questions surrounding the 6th FASU Games which were supposed to be hosted by Senegal in September 2012, before Senegal pulled out at a late stage prompting a search for a new host to salvage the games. Other issues discussed included; the

It is hoped that this diversification in FASU program will give more opportunities to students to experience what university sports has to offer and will be stepping stone to competitively participate at FISU and other International engagements.

The hotel, Lake Victoria Entebbe, which was the venue for the meeting, is one of the venues for the 2014 World University Cross Country championship. This was therefore a great opportunity for the FASU Executive Board to have an input in the preparations of the World University Cross Country Championship by evaluating the hotel.

WEST AFRICA HONOURS FASU EXECUTIVE BOARD

As an appreciation for the great support FASU has always offered to the West Africa University Games (WAUG), the outgoing president of WAUG Prof. Lasun Emiola, while presenting his final report of office to the FASU Executive Committee, awarded members honorary gold medals of participation in the 13th West Africa University Games.

Prof. Emiola, while presenting the medals at Lake Victoria Hotel Entebbe in Uganda, told the members that WAUG would not be where it is now if it was not for the great support of the FISU through FASU, the continental body. "WAUG has always benefited from FISU's generosity to Africa through FASU. We boost of the games attended by a large students' community from the West African

region. With the ongoing project of realignment of the region, under the support of FASU, I am sure we shall go a long way in promoting University Sports" Said Prof. Emiola

While receiving the award, the 1st FASU Vice President, Mr. Leopold Senghor was happy with the work of WAUG. The FASU President, who had personally graced the games thanked the regional body for the great work done, noting that it was such a great experience to have over forty (40) University Vice chancellors sending goodwill messages to the host Vice Chancellor. With the indirect participation of the Vice Chancellors/ Rectors it is hoped that most of them shall respond to our requests to attend the Rector's forum in Sweden 11-14 June 2013.

NIGERIA SUCCESSFULLY HOSTS THE 13TH WEST AFRICA UNIVERSITY GAMES (WAUG)

The 13th West Africa University Games (WAUG) was held very successfully at the University of Ilorin, Ilorin, Nigeria, from Tuesday March 27th to Saturday April 7th, 2012. The regional event attracted 56 participating Universities; 1 of which was an observer and other five 5 only attended the General Assembly. A total of 1,443 athletes, 372 team officials, and over 400 Technical officials from all the 5 member countries took part in program which had 13 Olympic sports.



The competition was declared open at a colourful ceremony on Saturday 31st March, 2012 by the Federal Minister of Sports/Chairman National Sports Commission who represented the President Dr. Goodluck Jonathan. Present were various dignitaries including Dr. Malumbete RALETHE, FASU President and Prof. Ernest AWANTA, FASU Internal Auditor, The Federal Minister of Education and members of Kwara State Executive Council. The members of the FASU Executive took time to interact with various stakeholders in the region and also students as they enjoyed the highly competitive events where the University of Port Harcourt took the overall trophy.

In his words, the outgoing WAUG president Prof. Lasun EMIOLA said;

“WAUG appreciates very much, the support of FASU/FISU and all the Vice-Chancellors, officials and even the athletes – our leaders of tomorrow without who, there can be no WAUG.”

The Games were declared closed on Friday 6th April, 2012 by the Kwara State Governor Abdulfatai Hammed, who was represented by the Kwara State Commissioner for Youths and Sports.

After a one day meeting on 9th February which saw delegates from six (6) countries meet at the offices of the National University Sports Federation of Cameroon (FENASU) housed in the building of the ministry of higher education and sports, a resolution was passed to form FASU-ZAC and setup an executive committee charged with ensuring

excellence and development of University Sports in the Central African Region. Countries represented included Cameroon, Central Africa Republic, Congo Brazzaville, DR Congo, Equatorial Guinea, and Chad. Only representatives of two nations (Sao Tome & Principe and Gabon) did not make it to the meeting.

On 10th February, in the conference room of Hotel Des Deputes in Yaoundé – Cameroon, the FASU Executive committee, overwhelmed with joy, ratified the regional association and welcomed them into the FASU family.

TISAN wins 16th CUCSA Games, Windhoek - July 2012.

The 16th Africa Zone 6 Student Games organized under the auspices of the Confederation of University and College Sports Associations (CUCSA) was held in Windhoek, Namibia from 16 to 20 July 2012.

The Tertiary Institutes Sports Association of Namibia (TISAN) won Gold in Football, Tennis, Volleyball and Netball and dominated Athletics but came up short of success in Chess, Table Tennis and Basketball as the CUCSA Games concluded in Windhoek in July 2012 to claim the overall championship trophy.

6TH FASU GAMES TO TAKE PLACE THIS DECEMBER 15TH – 22ND WINDHOEK, NAMIBIA

The 6th Africa University Games were scheduled to be held in Dakar, Senegal in September 2012 after Ghana faced challenges in hosting the Games. The confirmation came in during the National University Games of Senegal taking place from 1st -7th April 2011.

Following a communication from Senegal that it was not possible to host the games as scheduled due to various challenges, the Executive Board engaged other National University Sports Federations to salvage the games. TISAN (Tertiary Institutes Sports Associations of Namibia) agreeing to host the games in December 2012.

18 countries have confirmed participation in the 6th Edition, exceeding the participation in the 5th FASU Games Kampala, 2008 by 4 countries. The countries include; Algeria, Benin, Botswana, Central African Republic, Comoros, Congo,

DRC, Egypt, Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Senegal, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

According to The president of TISAN and chair of the Organizing Committee of the 6th FASU Games 2012 Mr. Werner Jeffery, they adopted the games slogan, “UNITED ON THE SMILE OF AFRICA” because their country, Namibia, is widely regarded by many as the smile of Africa due to its Democratic Government, Diverse population that live together in harmony, the vast desert, semi-desert and also sub-tropical landscapes, the rough untouched ocean and the richness in diamonds, platinum and our fishing industry.

The Logo symbolizes African student athletes, coming together in Namibia under the banner of FASU, to compete against each other in different sport codes and also experience the warm Namibian hospitality that we are known for. The logo has received a lot of support from the FASU family through the social network forums.

From an Oceania perspective the Executive Board of OUSA has refreshed the 2012-13 OUSA Strategic Plan to try and achieve FISU Presidents view and to also meet the more detailed audit and performance management activities required of all FISU Continental Associations during 2012.

At its September 2012 meeting the FISU Executive approved the recommendations of the FISU CDSU (Committee for Sports Development) to fund three key projects put forward by OUSA for implementation during the 2012 -13 period.

Project no 1 is about Governance and Leadership which aims to build a consistent approach and understanding of the governance of both OUSA and NUSF in the Oceania region and to support the talented students and staff to take a more proactive leadership approach to FISU activities.

My Unisport Team management is Project no 2 which aims to Building and sharing knowledge for the efficient delivery of university sporting

events and effective team management within the Oceania region.

Third project supported by FISU is about Sport Development with the aim of this project to ensure a number of student athletes from across FISU-Oceania are able to come together in an inaugural OUSA Beach Sport event in late 2013.

2013 is also a Universiade year and –in addition to the three FISU Oceania Projects- much of our attention will be on ensuring that our members receive the necessary information and support from FISU and the Games Organising Committees to assist their athletes attend these World sporting event. The 2013 OUSA General Assembly will also be held in conjunction with the 2013 Summer Universiade and FISU General Assembly in July in Kazan, Russia.

With a truly horrendous Cyclone devastating two of our member countries in late 2012 this catastrophe is an additional challenge affecting the smooth supply of information to and ability to resource participation in what is already one of the largest and remote regions of FISU. However what we can be assured of is the great Team Oceania spirit that pervades whenever the FISU family gathers together!
