Dear friends from the fields of education and university sports, I am so delighted to greet you here and wish you a Happy New Year in 2019 on this occasion.

2018 was a busy and productive year for our Federation. The 4th Asian University 3x3 Basketball Championship was held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and the inaugural AUSF Football Cup was held in Jinjiang, China. As the Qualifying Tournaments for FISU events, the competitions were highlighted by high-performance teams, professional technical teams nominated by AFs or IFs, wide-ranging media coverage, efficient organizing etc. For 2 consecutive years, Asian teams captured the Champions of 3x3 FISU World University Basketball League Finals.

Beside the Championships, 2nd FISU-AUSF Strategic Dialogue and 10th AUSF General Assembly were also held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia this October. The Dialogue provided a platform for over 100 delegates from FISU, AUSF, EUSA, and FISU-Oceania engaging university sports to discuss key issues that affect the university sport sector. It was highlighted with the theme of social, economic and political impact of university sports as well as attempting to discover challenges facing the development of university sports. The Dialogue presented an excellent platform for FISU, AUSF and its member federations to strengthen communication and establish a wide-ranging, multi-tiered and comprehensive opportunity for friendship and cooperation. According to the comments from different parties, the topics of the Dialogues were more interesting and targeted.

Following the Dialogue, the 10th AUSF General was held with 25 out of 38 members present. During the Assembly besides the reports by the executive committee, the legal committee was established with Mr. Feng Jinwen from China being nominated as chair of Legal Committee. He will lead the Committee to review and enhance the existing regulation and laws to better serve and protect the rights of member federations.

At the same time, Timor-Leste, Brunei, Laos and Myanmar applied to be AUSF members, bringing the total AUSF membership to 42. During the Assembly, AUSF inked a partnership agreement with KELME (CHINA) CO., LTD, a Spanish Sports Brand Company who will sponsor AUSF Championships with sports equipment in 2019. In addition, China announced to offer 20 scholarships to student-athletes from AUSF member federations to study in China. Last but not least, the AUSF extended the strategic partnership with FISU-Oceania based on previous successful cooperation, through which both parties looked forward to working together on more joint-projects during the next MoU period.

The achievements of the year has been very encouraging and inspiring. On this occasion, together with my colleagues in AUSF Executive Committee, I would like to express our heartfelt appreciation to all the member federations, the Organizing Committees of past and future events, the participants, our Partners, International University Sports Federation, other Continental University Sports Federations, and all the individuals who are passionate about university sports and the youths.

Once again, I wish you all a Happy New Year in 2019! See you in 2019! Let's Work Hard and Dream Big together!

AUSF Activities 2018

4th Asian University 3x3 Basketball Championship

The 4th Asian University 3x3 Basketball Championship was held from 10th to 14th July 2018 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, with 14 men's teams and 12 women's teams from 9 countries and regions - including China, Hong Kong China, Iran, Macau China, Malaysia, Mongolia, Sri Lanka, Thailand and Chinese Taipei - taking part in this Championship.

The Opening Ceremony was held at MABA Arena in Kuala Lumpur, which is the home venue of Malaysia Basketball Team and also the competition venue this time. Prof. Dato' Dr. Hassan Basri Awang Mat Dahan, Chairman of Malaysian University Sports Council (MASUM), Mr. SEETOW Cheng Fave, AUSF Treasurer, Mr. Tony Azaman Hassan, Principal Assistance Secretary from Sports Division (Higher Learning) of Ministry of Education of Malaysia, Mr. Sim Sin Heng, Deputy Secretary General of MABA and MASUM Board members were present at the Ceremony. Mr. Hassan welcomed all the participants and expressed the gratitude towards AUSF's trust for attributing this event to Malaysia. On behalf of AUSF, Mr. Seetow encouraged all the participants to take full advantage of this championship to cultivate sportsmanship, foster friendship and strengthen cultural ties. He also invited MASUM to host more AUSF events in the future.

After 4 days of fierce competition, the men's team from Civil Aviation University of China and women's

team from Chinese Culture University (Chinese Taipei) dominated the Championship. Together with men's team from Payam E Noor University (Iran) and women's team from Dhurakij Pudnit University (Thailand), the four teams qualified for the 3x3

FISU World University League Finals in the November of 2018. The 5th Asian University 3x3 Basketball Championship will be held from 8th to 10th May, 2019 in Kinmen, Chinese Taipei. Be Ready!

KELME 2018 AUSF Football Cup

KELME 2018 AUSF Football Cup took place in Jinjiang, China in October, with over 500 athletes forming 23 teams and officials participating, representing 14 Asian countries and regions. This was a record number of participating students, and countries or regions in the history of AUSF Championships. This inaugural edition of the Football Cup has evolved from the past AUSF Football Championships, and it showcased both a high level competition as well as fascinating cultural activities.

The event was co-organized by Federation of University Sports of China and Jinjiang Municipal Government, both of which invested tremendous efforts to make the tournament a success. These included organizing pre-

competition high-profile press conference, providing high-standard competition venues and technical support, inviting reputable media at local and national level to cover the event as well as supplying live streaming channels that reached many online audience.

Remarkable Games

Over the 12 days of competition, there were a total of 64 matches in the tournament. There was no lack of intense and high level matches, contested between the participating teams who were top university teams selected from Asian members.

The Men's Final was contested between Bangkok Thonburi University (BTU) from Thailand and Myongji University (MJU)

from Korea and it turned out to be one of the most dramatic matches in the tournament. The Korean men's team led all the way with a score of 2 – 1 during regulation time. However BTU from Thailand fought all the way and their efforts paid off in the dying seconds, when the goalkeeper came forward and scored a beautiful header with last the free kick of the match, sending over 20,000 spectators into wild celebration. In 90 high-octane minutes the two teams played to a draw. In the end, BTU defeated MJU 6-5 on penalty kicks and were crowned the men's champion.

The Enlightening Cultural Program

Apart from top level competition, this event was also paired with cultural activities, giving student

athletes and officials opportunities to experience and learn about the extensive and rich Chinese culture and the folk customs of local Minyue Culture. This included traditional Chinese painting and calligraphy, hand-painted opera mask, tea art, sand painting, cloth dying, ceramic art and others. At these workshops, the charm of Chinese culture fascinated the many participants from different parts of Asia, and they could use their own creativity and talent to produce works of arts with their own style under the kind guidance of the professional teachers.

Finals

It is worth mentioning that Thailand claimed both Men's and Women's title in the tournament, Bangkok Thonburi University ranked first in men's category while College of Asian Scholars from Thailand was the champion in women's category, resulting in both advancing proudly to the 2019 FISU World Cup-Football. 2nd FISU-AUSF Strategic Dialogue

AUSF President XUE Yanqing

The 2nd edition of FISU-AUSF Strategic Dialogue was officially convened in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on 19th October 2018 with the attendance of over 100 delegates from FISU, AUSF, EUSA, and FISU-Oceania as well as local university sports personnel. The dialogue centered on the theme of social, economic and political impact of university sports as well as challenges facing the development of university sports.

It commenced with an official welcome address from MASUM Chairman Prof Dato' Dr Hassan Basri Awang Mat Dahan, AUSF President XUE Yanqing, FISU 1st Vice President Leonz Eder, FISU Oceania President Martin Doulton, and EUSA President

Adam Roczek who made opening addresses expressing in chorus appreciation of the local organizer and placed high expectation on the dialogue. FISU President Oleg Matytsin provided a video welcome message to the delegates and congratulated AUSF on the successful events held continuously for the past two years.

The keynote address by AUSF President XUE Yanqing touched on the importance of branding events, sponsorship, partners, dialogue and active members which collectively helped to advance university sport in Asia. He also introduced the setting up of a AUSF HELP Program which would assist AUSF members to participate in championships as well as educational events. Delegates were also given information about university sport success in China, which clearly showcased the interdependence between sport development, social, economic and political factors.

FISU 1st Vice President Leonz

Eder spoke about the long term value of sport for university students. He highlighted that sport fosters friendship, promotes health and wellbeing, maintains motivations and performance as well as uncovers hidden talent. He added that university sport has provided the platform to promote lifelong skills and healthy habits of university students and they also have the opportunity to open doors to others of the society and to show that university sport can contribute to everyone's health and wellbeing.

Matjaz Pecovnik, Secretary General of the European University Sports Association, was the third speaker who gave an overview of the European University Games which was first held in Spain in 2012. The Games consist of 9 core sports and 3 optional sports and in 2018, competitions in table tennis and swimming were open to athletes with disability. A video recap of the event was shown which portrayed the happiness that sport brings to university students.



Leonz Eder, FISU 1st Vice President

After a short break, Ms. Julia Cai from AUSF sponsor KELME(China) gave an overview of the KELME sports brand and its long association with sports across the world. KELME is a brand that has established a close association with the Chinese Football Leagues for both men and women. In 2018, KELME became a sponsor of campus football which is their entry into the university sport sector. They have committed to be an official partner of AUSF.

The first panel discussion in the morning allowed delegates to raise questions to Leonz Eder, Matjaz Pecovnik, Ms Julia Cai and President Xue. Discussions included qualification to attend FISU events, participation opportunities, sponsorship, support for NUSFs to host future events, communication, transfer of knowledge and logistics involved in the European University Games and in attending AUSF or FISU championships.

In the afternoon, FISU Secretary General, Eric Saintrond continued to provide insights into the challenges of hosting sporting events in major cities. Mr. Saintrond highlighted the busy international sporting calendar as well as other issues that affect sport such as doping, illegal betting, corruption, violence

and racism. He then brought up the challenge that is changing interests of young people from tradition sports to new and emerging sports.

Suggestions were presented on how to promote the benefits of hosting a sporting event which includes legacy, media coverage, economic impact, social impact, positive contribution to physical and mental health as well as a training and educational opportunity for the younger generation, with the legacy and local impact being the real value of hosting events.

Expanding on challenges for sporting events, Dr. Abdul Halim Mokhtar provided in-depth education about doping in sport. An outline of the different types of substances was given, along

with the details about testing processes and doping rule violations. Dr. Halim emphasised that education was the key to ensuring an athlete not to be tempted to dope to boost their performance.

The second panel discussion provided Eric Saintrond, Omar A Al-Hai and Dr Mokhtar the opportunity to address questions raised by the floor, one of which was the emergence of e-sport events, which are gradually becoming a popular sport among youngsters.

In the final session of the dialogue, Mr. Saintrond presented the exciting schedule of FISU events for 2019 including updates on the winter and summer Universiades in Krasnoyarsk and Naples respectively and other key FISU projects for 2019. It was noted that FISU would also further extend its digital platforms to bring more live coverage of university sport to more people via social media and via the Olympic channel.

The world of University Sport is rich mix of wonderful cultures, and only through continuing communication and working together could the university sport throughout the world be further developed. The FISU-AUSF Strategic Dialogue will continue to provide the platform for future engagement and interaction.



10th AUSF General Assembly



On 20 October 2019, AUSF welcomed its 10th General Assembly in Kuala Lumpur with 25 out of 38 members attending the biennial meeting. Distinguished guests from FISU, EUSA, and FISU Oceania were present to witness the event. During the assembly, reports delivered by AUSF President, Secretary General, Treasurer and chairs of five sub-committees were well received.

The assembly was opened with the report of commission for checking of mandates and the roll call of member federations. Malaysia University Sports Council (MASUM) Chairman, Prof Dato' Dr Hassan Basri Awang Mat

Dahan and other sports dignitaries including FISU 1st Vice President Leonz Eder, FISU Oceania President Martin Douulton, EUSA President Adam Roczet and AUSF Honorary President Chong Tong Gu, all made congratulatory addresses on the remarkable achievements AUSF made over the past years.

AUSF President Xue Yanqing highlighted specifically in his report the achievements made in the past two years including successful attribution of championship events across the region; regular education projects like strategic dialogue and joint seminar with FISU Oceania; establishment of five sub-regional

committees within the continent to ensure a more active member engagement as well as the fruitful project work completed by the five AUSF sub committees.

Several other new achievements were highlighted during the assembly.

The Legal Committee was established and Mr. Feng Jinwen was officially approved as chair of Legal Committee, which is expected to enhance the regulations of future AUSF projects development.

Secondly, four new members including Timor-Leste, Brunei, Laos and Myanmar have been



officially admitted as new members of AUSF, expanding the number of AUSF member federations to 42.

Thirdly, with concerted efforts

made by AUSF family, AUSF has set up an official partnership with KELME(CHINA)CO.,LTD, a brand-name sports company, which will sponsor AUSF Championships with sports

equipment and attires.

It was also announced that China will be offering 20 full scholarships to student-athletes from AUSF member federations who would like to study in Chinese Universities.

Finally, AUSF renewed the strategic partnership with FISU-Oceania, through which both parties looked forward to working together on more joint-projects during the next MoU period.

The meeting also reviewed the progress reports, confirmed the 2019 sports calendar, with official attribution letters presented to the hosts.

Basketball

The 4th AUSF 3x3 Basketball Championship was held from 10th to 14th July in Malaysia. Four university teams of Iran - Payame Noor (Men and Women), Islamic Azad University (Women) and Tehran University (Men) - participated in this event. At the end of the championship, university of Payame Noor (Men) qualified to attend FISU World League by finishing in second place.



Football

The AUSF Football cup was held from 29th October- 11th November 2018 in China. University of Applied Science and Technology football team (Men) attended this event. They finished 8th in the tournament.

World University Championship



Sport Shooting

The 7th World University Sport Shooting Championship was held from 14th to 18th March in Malaysia. Iran participated with 10 athletes in both rifle and pistol events. Achievement of these athletes from this competition was 1 bronze medal that was won by Najme Khedmati.

Sport Climbing

Iran participated in the 2nd World University Sport Climbing Championship in Slovakia with four athletes. They achieved 1 bronze medal by Mahdi Alipourshenazandifard.



Karate

The 11th World University Karate Championship was held from 19th to 22nd July in Kobe, Japan. The Iranian men and women competitors participated in this event after spending 10 days at a training camp with the Japanese athletes before the championship. The fourth edition of 3x3 FISU World University League was held from 15th to 18th November in Xiamen. After competing in 5 matches, Iran finished the tournament in 5th position.

FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy

Iran has participated in FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy with 2 students who were studying sport management in Ph.D. They will be FISU ambassadors for 1 year, helping to promote FISU and their events.

FISU Forum

Three delegates of Iranian student and official (2 men and 1 woman) have participated in 14th FISU Forum that was organised in Krasnoyarsk City, Russian Federation from 6th to 10th August.

Other Championships

The 2nd AUAP (Association of Universities of Asia and Pacific) Inter-University Basketball Competition was held from 16th to 24th September in China. Basketball team of Tehran University achieved gold medal in the competition. In addition, Asghar Khodadoust was chosen as the best player of this event.

Meetings

Appreciation Ceremony

The Appreciation Ceremony of university students who received medals in summer Universiade 2017 was held on 5th March in conference hall of Students Affairs Organization with attendance of medalists and their technical officials. Vice- Minister of Science, Research and Technology ministry, and Federation presidents, representative of National Olympic Committee of Iran and President and General Secretary of NUSF of Iran showed their appreciation of the achievements by giving out the awards on this occasion.



Executive Committee Meeting

The Executive Committee Meeting of NUSF of Iran is organized monthly for development and sport program submission, supervision of activities, allocation of funds and budget for provincial boards and their activities, supervision of committees and sub committees functions with regards to the strategic plan of the Federation.



Technical Committee Meeting

Technical Committee of NUSF of Iran will organize meeting to study the potential of sports in universities and define a program for events participation. In 2018 this committee had held meeting to plan for summer Universiade 2019. They discussed and planned scheduled events on participation in sports, camp and other technical programs needed for participating in Universiade 2019.



IDUS Celebration

On 20 September, IUSF organized related events to celebrate the International Day of University sport. This celebration was held with cooperation of universities of different cities of Iran. Over 1500 participants from all universities tried to promote university sport among the people and encourage them to join in sport events. Activities like Archery, Skating, Flying Disk, Kung Fu, and Motorcycling, Horse riding, Zoorkhane (National sport of Iran) and workshops were organised by students, university employees and the public. Beside these activities, 14 students and employees of Tarbiat Modares University climbed Dena Mountain and they reached the highest peak of this mountain- Ghash Mastan (4450 m)- located



in Kohgiluyeh & Boyer-Ahmad province. Boali University of Hamadan gathered students, employees and people for some walking activities.

In shooting sports, Team Korea got 4 gold, 1 silver, 5 bronze medal and placed 2nd place in a total. In Golf, Team Korea swept all the events in women sports. (Both team event and individual event, winning the 1st, 2nd, 3rd place). This result is very encouraging because most of the women's player took part in the first international competition. In Handball, the men's team won the champion and women's team got 3rd place. The students learnt know-how when they met with European teams which were physically strong. In cheerleading, Team Korea got silver in 'Large Coed' division. In badminton, Team Korea got 6 medals (2 silver and

4 bronze) in 6 sports. We could notice conspicuous possibility for the university players.

All the students participated in WUC 2018 had great opportunity to demonstrate their ability. Based on their experience, they could show their best performance in the Universiade Napoli 2019.

The KUSB also sent Myungji University Football team as a representative delegation to the 2018 AUSF Football Cup in Jinjang, China. We achieved 2nd place and will go on next stage for the FISU University World Cup 2019.

In total 2,165 student athletes (1,281 men and 884 women) from 37 universities in capital city and provinces of Mongolia, 189 coaches and 106 referees participated in the NUC 2018 Mongolia.

This year one of the important features of the NUC Mongolia was that the competitions were named after the universities which hosted specific sporting competition of NUC at their campuses. Particularly, National University of Mongolia (NUM) organized the basketball, volleyball and cheerleading sport events in honor of the 75th anniversary of the Department of Physical Education, NUM. The universities that cooperated with MSSF were Mongolian National University of Education (Judo and Handball), Mon-Altius Physical Education Institute (Chess and Futsal), National Institute of Physical Education (Wrestling and



Mongolian National University Championship of 2018 Completed Ulaanbaatar

Under management of the Mongolian Student Sports Federation (MSSF) and in cooperation with local universities, the National University Championship (NUC)-2018 started with judo competition on March 3, 2018 and ended with tug-of-war on May 12, 2018. After two months of continuous organization, NUC Mongolia was comprised of 13 sport disciplines - basketball, volleyball, cheerleading,

Table tennis), Mongolian National Defense University (Taekwondo), Mongolian State University of Life Sciences (Woodball), Mongolian University of Science and Technology (Athletics), and "Avarga" Physical Education Institute (Tug-of-War).

The largest number of teams participated in following competitions are as follows: wrestling had 23 university teams, taekwondo had 19, basketball had 18, judo had 16, volleyball and table tennis each had 15 university teams.

NUM, Mongolian State University of Life Sciences, National Institute of Physical Education and Mon-Altius Physical Education Institute successfully trained their athletes and participated in all 13 sport disciplines. In addition, student-athletes of the Mongolian State University of Life Sciences, "Avarga" Physical

Education Institute, Mongolian National University of Education, IkhZasag International University and Mongolian National Defense University took part in more than 10 sport events.

Since the NUC has been organized among Mongolian students, the final results of all participating universities were assessed by the quality of medals for the first time, which was another important feature of this year's championship. In previous championships, the overall results were calculated by scoring system which consisted in summing up the number of medals received in each respective event.

This year the Mongolian National University of Education was awarded the first place' winning 15 gold, 14 silver and 16 bronze medals in the National University Championship 2018 in 13 different sporting events. National Institute

of Physical Education took the second place with 13 gold, 22 silver and 33 bronze medals. The Mongolian University of Science and Technology's team won third place with 11 gold, 5 silver and 5 bronze medals. The fourth place went to the "Avarga" Physical Education Institute, winning 8 gold and 5 bronze medals, and in the fifth place was the Mongolian State University of Life Sciences with 7 gold, 7 silver and 7 bronze medals.

All participants of the National University Championship of Mongolia 2018 competed for 274 medals (79 gold, 79 silver and 116 bronze), representing 24 various universities from all over Mongolia and participated in one of the biggest student sporting event in the country.

The winners of this National University Championship 2018 were selected respectfully to





participate in the Asian University Football Cup Championship in October in Jinjiang, China, and in the 3x3 Basketball Championship which was held in July in Kuala-Lumpur, Malaysia.

National Dialogue on IDUS 2018

On the occasion of the International Day of University Sport, the Mongolian Student Sports Federation (MSSF) successfully organized the National Strategic Dialogue: "Problems facing Mongolian student sports and ways to solve them" at the Teacher's Development Center of the Mongolian National University of Education.

Over 110 students and faculty staff from 20 universities got engaged

in the dialogue while some officials such as Mrs. Yanjmaa O. Officer for Ministry of Education, Culture, Science and Sports Mongolia, Mr. BatsaikhanKh. Vice President of MSSF and Member of Education Committee of FISU, Mrs. Gerelmaa S. Head of the Prevention Department in the National Center for Public Health, and Board Members of MSSF Mr. Tserensodnom L., Mrs. Gundegmaa L., Mrs. Enkhtuya S. and Erdenepurev L. attended as speakers in this significant event.

In terms of the dialogue, following crucial issues were discussed: activities of the MSSF and organizing plan of Universiade 2019, the state of physical education in Mongolian universities and their further implementation policies, the current state of health for Mongolian students, the issues of training specialists

in physical culture and sports in universities of physical education, physical education program at the Mongolian University of Science and Technology, the development of university sport in the National University of Mongolia, the researches of the physical development of students participating in the "Student-Soldier" program. Therefore, MSSF pointed out the opportunities of volunteer students, significance of



volunteering, and growth of volunteerism in the scope of university sport in Mongolia during the IDUS 2018.

At the end of the dialogue, many ideas, comments, and conclusions were combined, which will be added in policies and action plans of the MSSF in the future.

FISU and AUSF Championships, Events

At the International University Sports Federation 2018 championships, MSSF had 21 athletes and representatives in 4 sports: 3x3 FISU league, speed skating, weightlifting and cheerleading. Weightlifter Anuujiin G. won the silver.

MSSF also participated in AUSF events including AUC

3x3 Basketball and 2018 AUSF Football Cup. Mongolian Men's basketball team won the bronze medal in AUC 3x3 Basketball.

National University of Mongolia student volunteer Ms. Khaliunaa successfully participated in the FISU volunteer leader academy.



University Sports Association Nepal



University Sports Association of Nepal (USAN) is one of the Umbrella Association of Nepal which is combined by 9 different Nepalese Universities in Nepal.

USAN Nepal has been conducted a South Asian Sub Regional Sports Seminar on the Occasion of IDUS on 20 September, 2018, which was a very fruitful meeting in Kathmandu with the participation of South Asian countries. Meanwhile, National Sports Associations and Federations, government authorities, Nepal Olympic Committee, Students and many athletes joined this seminar as well.

USAN has participated in 4 different world university championships in 2018, including Muaythai (3 athletes) in Thailand, Wushu (3 athletes) in Macau, China, Weightlifting in Poland (2 athletes), and Badminton (1 athlete) in Malaysia. Nepal team got historical victory in WUC Wushu, as Prakash Budhamagar, the male athlete won the 6th position in his category. And the team earned experience and learnt a lot of techniques in this event.

From 2014, USAN has been regularly participating in WUC Badminton. Though lacking of financial support from government, USAN tried our best to participate FISU and AUSF event.

The Federation has also founded a student media federation called Student Sports Union (SUU) in 2007. This SUU has nurtured many outstanding talented professionals like FOX Sports anchor, Yi-Wen Lin and I-Li How. In addition, CTUSF also founded a YouTube channel "SSUtv Sports" and set up UBA Score App so that the audience can get to watch games on the Internet. Apart from these, CTUSF also held

other sports competitions such as cheerleading, dancing, and so on, and these events are targeted not only at athletes but also the general student population with little or no experience in sports. These initiatives have not only given students a stage to showcase their passion and talent in sports but will also go a long way towards the steady progress of university sports.

To celebrate the 2018 International Day of University Sport, CTUSF collaborated with FOX Sports to conduct "2018 SSU Reporters Establish Plan". Since early September this year,

SSU reporters started to visit outdoors broadcast vehicles and have studio tours. Stone Chang, the VP of FOX Sports and Assistant Manager, Ms. Lee, also shared their experiences with SSU reporters and encouraged them to follow their dreams.

The Taipei 2017 Summer Universiade has brought renewed enthusiasm in sports, particularly with Team Chinese Taipei setting a new best record in terms of medals and results. The record performances included that of the world's top women's singles badminton player, Tzu-ying Tai, women's 58-kilogram class world



record holder Hsing-chun Kuo, artistic gymnast Chih-Kai Lee, and sprinter Chun-han Yang. Many of the athletes continued their excellent physical and mental conditions, and won the medals again in Jakarta Palembang 2018 Asian Games.

In October 2017, the Fu Jen Catholic Sports Medical Center was established. Dr. Han-Sun Chiang – who is also the President of Fun Jen Catholic University, reiterated the purpose of establishing the Center is to provide the young athletes with professional techniques and services in every aspect, making them well-cared and all backed-up. By doing so, the athletes can take do their best in the sporting arenas, leading Chinese Taipei to step onto the international stage.

In 2019, CTUSF will be hosting 3 very important AUSF events.

The 2019 Asian University 3x3 Basketball Championship will be taking place in Kinmen, Chinese Taipei during 8-11 May 2019. As this competition is also the qualification event to FISU 3x3 Basketball League, it is expected there will be many countries participating in this event in order to stand a chance to qualify for the FISU 3x3 Finals. In addition to the competition, a 3x3 basketball workshop will take place during the championship. There will be

2 keynote speakers who are professional in 3x3 basketball training and body recovery to share at this workshop.

The 1st Asian University Badminton Championship will be taking

place in New Taipei City in September 2019. At the same time the FISU-AUSF Seminar will be held in conjunction with the Championship. The International Day of University Sports

celebration will also be part of the events. During the seminar, professional keynote speakers will be invited to share their experience and ideas. This event will not only offer the opportunity for NUSF officials to understand FISU and AUSF development but also provide a platform for them to share their challenges and best practices.

Chinese Taipei has much experience in organizing the competitions and educational events. In 2019, once again we are ready to bring more impressing events to the Asian university students. Don't miss them and see you in Chinese Taipei soon.

Arab University Sports Federation



The Second Arab Beach Games 2018 - Morocco

The second Arab Beach Games (ABG) were held in Agadir, Morocco from 19-23 April 2018.

10 Arab countries including Jordan, UAE, Algeria, Sudan, Iraq, Sultanate of Oman, Palestine, Lebanon, Egypt and Morocco participated.

The ABG included three sports: beach volleyball, beach football and a 10km road race.

Zayed Futsal Championship 2018 – Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

The Zayed Futsal Championship was held in Abu Dhabi from 3 to 11 October 2018 and was attended by 12 Arab countries: Jordan, UAE, Bahrain, Algeria, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Iraq, Oman, Palestine, Kuwait, Egypt and Yemen.



Jordan won the first place, followed by Kuwait in the second place and Egypt in the third place.

Higher Education Sports Federation Seminar 2018 Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

Symposium: Sport from the Perspective of Innovation and Creativity

The seminar was held in Abu Dhabi on 24 December 2018 in the presence of sports leaders



in the United Arab Emirates and members of the General Assembly of the Arab University Sports Federation. The seminar discussed the following topics:

1. Sports from the perspective of innovation and creativity.
2. Abu Dhabi Sports Council strategy and encouragement for innovation and creativity.
3. Sports, innovation and creativity in Arab universities looking forward to the future.

The Emergency General Assembly of the Arab University Sports Federation- Abu Dhabi

The General Assembly of the Arab University Sports Federation was held in Abu Dhabi, on December 25th with the participation of 16 Arab countries. The participants discussed the amendment of some articles of the statute of the Arab University Sports Federation.



FISU Activities



With a record number of participants in its Championships, a significant move back to campus and several ambitious new projects, the year 2018 has been one of revitalisation for FISU and one that has brought the university sports movement ever closer to students worldwide.

Six thousand, seven hundred and eighty-eight – that’s the total number of participants who were at the 2018 FISU World University Championships. This considerable number was a record in itself, in a year that saw new beginnings and many firsts for the International University Sports Federation.

The tone was set right from the start of the year, when in a very significant move, FISU went

‘back to campus’. After bidding adieu to the offices in Brussels, FISU began a fresh chapter in February by inaugurating a new headquarters in the heart of the Olympic Capital – Lausanne, Switzerland. In keeping with its raison d’être as the governing body of university sport, the FISU Headquarters are now fittingly located on a university campus; the sprawling greens of the University of Lausanne

(UNIL). With this move back to campus, FISU began the year on a poignant note.

FISU’s bonds with universities and campuses worldwide were strengthened from there on, with far reaching and ambitious plans like the Healthy Campus project which aims to bring the entire university community into the fold, and not just elite athletes.

“FISU has to take care of the health of all students,” says FISU Secretary General & CEO, Eric Saintrond. “It is a fact that a huge number of students are inactive or not active enough. It is for this reason that FISU is launching the Healthy Campus project, as it will provide opportunities to all students to participate in recreational sport and physical activity. The universities will be provided the tools through which they will implement and manage this project.”

The Healthy Campus project was announced along with the formation of a new Academic Advisory Board, on the FISU President’s personal initiative. This Advisory Board comprises of rectors of various universities around the world, who provide expertise and feedback to further promote university sports, Olympic values and the FISU brand.

FISU’s sport events continue to be at the heart of the university sports movement and the World University Championships this year were unprecedented in scale, success and quality. Thirty-two standalone championships were held through the year, which collectively witnessed the highest number of participants ever seen in a championship season. The

6,788 championship competitors represented 1,673 universities and 92 countries and regions. The message of university sport was spread far and wide through quality competition in a wide array of sports from Karate to Beach Volleyball, Sailing to Rugby 7s.

The World University Championship programme is FISU’s ‘incubator’ of sorts – forming the gateway for new sports and formats to make their way into the Universiade and University World Cups. This allows FISU to experiment with international sport federations to enhance sports delivery and innovation in their sport. This year marked the first time that Modern Pentathlon, Wushu, Muay Thai and Cheerleading were featured on the programme.

The sports calendar culminated with a successful fourth edition of the 3x3 FISU World University League – 2018 Finals in Xiamen, China. This unique tournament pits the world’s best university 3x3 teams against each other and has the student athletes playing for University pride, on a world stage.

It is the perfect setting for this young, urban sport as it makes its Olympic debut at the 2020 Summer Games in Tokyo, Japan. FISU was ahead of the curve,



recognising the popularity of this format as early as 2012, when it was part of the World University Championship schedule. Following its immediate success, the event is now staged annually as a World University League since 2015. The 2018 edition was bigger and better than ever before, with excellent event organisation and unprecedented number of viewers on its multi-channel live stream. Chinese teams dominated the competition, with home team Huaqiao University winning the men’s title and Tsinghua University topping the women’s podium. The quality of competition is evident from the fact that nearly half a dozen world Top-20 players were in action on the courts.

Away from the courts and fields, there was abundant action elsewhere as well. The FISU Forum witnessed robust discussions on the most important issues facing the sports world today – athlete dual careers, gender equality and good governance – through workshops, keynotes and open seminars. The format of the Forum also underwent a small but significant





shift, as more space was given to National University Sports Federations (NUSFs) to present their activities. The template has now been set for the next two editions of the FISU Forum that will be held 2020 in Budapest, Hungary and 2022 in Kiev, Ukraine.

Meanwhile, the FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy was held for the second time in Kazan, Russia. Aimed at developing tomorrow's leaders, this year the programme went one step further with the appointment of more than 100 emerging young sports leaders from different countries and regions as 'Student Ambassadors'. These flagbearers of the university sports movement have now taken the spirit and message of FISU back to their campus and communities. Exemplifying the success of this programme, was the Student Ambassador from Bosnia & Herzegovina Biljana Cvijanović,

who ensured that the International Day of University Sport (IDUS) was celebrated in her home town for the very first time. What the students of the University of Banja Luka lacked in resources, they made up for in spirit, as they hand-painted IDUS posters ahead of a 3x3 game that was held to celebrate the day.



This year's edition of IDUS was indeed a grand success, as 97 countries and regions participated with nearly 500 sporting and recreational activities organised specifically for the occasion. The day was celebrated across China with various activities that included more than 4000 participants. Singapore activated



a drug-free 'clean sport' campaign with athletes from different universities pledging their support. Chinese Taipei did something fun and different, by organising a workshop for students at the Fox TV studios, to learn about sports broadcast. Overall, the day was marked by innovative and enthusiastic celebrations the world over.

This year was also the first time that FISU's partner organising committees celebrated IDUS with gusto. The sunny Italian city of Napoli that will host the 2019 Summer Universiade held multiple sports events at university venues in Napoli and Salerno, with more than 300 students of sport participating. On the opposite end of the weather spectrum, the Siberian city of Krasnoyarsk in Russia held a special 'City Run' to celebrate IDUS. Krasnoyarsk will host the Winter Universiade 2019, making it the first time ever that Russia will be hosting this multi-sport spectacle.

With a pathbreaking, tone setting and extremely fruitful 2018 in the books, FISU looks ahead to 2019 with excitement for the Summer and Winter Universiades as well as the University World Cups in 3x3 Basketball and the inaugural edition of Football, both of which will take place in China's Fujian province, in Xiamen and Jinjiang respectively.

European University Sports Association



The European University Sports Association (EUSA) reflects back to 2018 with great pride and honour, looking forward to the 2019 – especially in the light of the 20th anniversary of the organisation.

For EUSA, the past year was marked by the 4th edition of the European Universities Games (EUG2018), which was held in Coimbra, Portugal between July 15 and 28, 2018. Officially opened by the President of the Republic of Portugal Mr. Marcelo Rebelo de Souza, the Games saw 4027 participants, forming 504 university teams, representing 289 universities from 38 countries in Europe. Under the slogan “A winner’s heartbeat!” thirteen sports were featured at the Games, also with inclusion of student athletes with disabilities: Badminton, Basketball, 3x3 Basketball, Canoe Sprint, Football, Futsal, Handball, Judo, Rowing, Rugby 7s, Table Tennis (including Para Table Tennis), Tennis and Volleyball. We are happy to report that competitions in all sports were held in male and female categories.

Alongside the sport competitions, the event focused also on educational and social aspects of university sport in Europe, including conferences and workshops in the topics of Clean Sport, Inclusion and Equality, Dual Career, as well as a Rectors



Conference. The legacy of the Games will be visibly clear as support from many institutions from across Europe and the local community helped in the development and renovation of university sports facilities in the city. The Games were organised under the umbrella of EUSA by the University of Coimbra, in cooperation with the Portuguese University Sport Federation (FADU), Municipality of Coimbra, and the Academic Association of Coimbra (AAC). Dedication of everyone involved and intense cooperation with the partners helped organise a great event.

EUSA also had its biennial ordinary General Assembly, accompanied by the Gala. The Assembly was held in Madrid, Spain, hosted by the Spanish University Sport Committee (CEDU) and the Camilo Jose Cela

sport events in Europe. EUSA President Mr Adam Roczek welcomed the representatives of the 37 member countries present and the guests, among them also the President of the International University Sports Federation (FISU) Mr Oleg Matytsin and the President of the Asian University Sport Federation (AUSF) Mr Yanqing Xue.

The Assembly reviewed the activities of the past two years, and accepted the EUSA Strategy, paving the road for the future of EUSA. During the Assembly, the official announcement of next host cities of the EUSA Games was made. European Universities Games 2022 will be held in Lodz, Poland, and that the cities of Miskolc and Debrecen in Hungary will host the seventh edition of the Games in 2024. Mr Olaf Tabor and Mr Leonz Eder received special distinctions by being awarded the title of EUSA Honorary Member for their significant contribution to university sport and its development. The Assembly concluded with the annual Gala, dedicated to honouring the best, celebrating top sports results and showing respect to continued commitment in European university sport.

The day after the EUSA General Assembly, the FISU-EUSA





Strategic Dialogue was held, giving an insight into strategy and vision of FISU and EUSA, main cooperation fields between the two organisations, and good practices in University sport in Europe. This was also a perfect opportunity for the Presidents of FISU and EUSA to sign a Memorandum of Understanding between the two organizations that will not only strengthen the cooperation, but help further progress university sport in Europe and in general.

Apart from the Assembly, Executive Committee members of EUSA had two official meetings in 2018; in March they were hosted in Paris, France by the French University Sport Federation (FFSU) and in October in Rome, Italy, hosted by the Italian University Sport Centre (CUSI).

EUSA continued cooperation with the partner organisations

and made new partnerships, including the European Olympic Committees (EOC). Council of Europe's member states of the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Sport (EPAS) granted the EUSA the observer status and membership to the EPAS Consultative Committee.

Apart from the regular sports and



education programme, EUSA and its Institute also continued the activities in the field of social responsibility through development fund and special projects. Current projects, co-financed by the Erasmus+ programme of the European Union, focus on clean sport, dual career, inclusion and equality, safeguarding in sport, skills



development and volunteering. EUSA and its members continued the tradition of celebrating the European Week of Sport and the International Day of University Sport (IDUS).

In 2019, EUSA sports calendar will focus on the European Universities Championships in

23 sports, held between June and September throughout Europe, bringing together over 4000 participants. In April, FISU-EUSA Seminar will be held in Ljubljana, Slovenia, aimed to support the staff within the member associations. And in

Pan-American University Sports Federation

2018 has been a year of great activity for FISU America, the Pan-American University Sports Organization and its members. Sportive and academic activities in the continent were consolidated with the first FISU America Games developed in Sao Paulo, Brazil, the second FISU America Forum in Huixquilucan, Mexico, and the second 3x3 Championship in Santa Tecla, El Salvador.

Besides that, national federations participated in several FISU World Championships, demonstrating

more presence in these kinds of events every year. Activities such as International Day of University Sport and Volunteer Leaders Academy had continental expression. And Authorities marked presence in FISU Meeting in Laussane.

The President of the organization, Alim Maluf Neto (BRA), and the Executive Committee, once again demonstrated organizational capacity and unity, complying with 2018 calendar with success and expected a much better 2019.

This is another sign of the growth and consolidation that university sport has had on the continent.

2nd FISU America 3x3 Championship



The Pan-American 3x3 basketball tournament developed jointly between the Salvadoran University Sport Association (Adusal) and FISU America, in the city of Santa Tecla, from June 26 to 30. The competition was qualifying for the FISU World League that took place in Xiamen, China, and the official ball was provided by the company Molten.

In the female branch, University of Chile was champion, after defeating National University of Colombia in the final with a 12-8 score. Among men, the champion was Center of University Studies of Mexico, which in the final imposed against University of Costa Rica by 22-16. Damaris Cota of Mexico won the 3-point throwing tournament, while among men also won Mexican Bryan Rivera. In skills, Maria Quero from Venezuela won, while Luis Castro got the diving tournament to CEU from Mexico.

América Alvarado, FISU America representative in the tournament, said, "There has been a great level and excellent players have been seen, which makes us feel proud to see that universities produce athletes who can not only play at the Pan American level but also worldwide. As for the organization, it has been a great effort of the Salvadoran University Sports Association, with the backing of the Mayor of Santa Tecla and FISU America, and a positive balance can be made. The effort has been worthwhile and as FISU America we are happy to know that the countries accompany our process and that the games are of quality."

1st FISU America Games

The best games in FISU America History got born with total success in Sao Paulo. From July 19 to 29,



Brazil, Argentina,

Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, United States, Honduras, Paraguay, Mexico and Uruguay competed in 10 sports disciplines: Athletics, basketball, soccer, futsal, judo, swimming, taekwondo, tennis, table tennis and volleyball. And in athletics, swimming and table tennis, there will also be Paralympic competition, as the first inclusive university games in the world.

At the FISU America Executive Committee meeting before the beginning of the event, all participating countries valued the importance of this event, in which 1400 student athletes participated. They were welcomed by FISU President Oleg Matytsin, Brazilian University Sport Association (CBDU) President and FISU Vice President Luciano Cabral, President of the Brazilian Olympic Committee Paulo Wanderley and President of FISU America Alim Maluf Neto.

University Sport House

Together with the competitions of Youth Olympic Games Buenos Aires 2018, FISU University Sports House was presented, located in a strategic place of the Olympic Park, next to the meeting point of the Argentine team and in front of the hockey stadium. The opening ceremony was attended by FISU president, Oleg Matytsin, members of the International Olympic Committee and FeDUA authorities. National University of La Matanza Rector, Daniel Martinez, representative of FISU America before the Academic Council of the FISU, also accompanied.

Matytsin, who valued and thanked the work of FeDUA in this project that had already been a reality, was one of those responsible for cutting the tapes together with Emiliano Ojea, president of FeDUA and FISU America Treasurer. Both leaders exchanged presents and celebrated that the University Sport had a space in the Olympic movement.

The University Sport House held activities, clinics and informative talks by sports students, professionals and rectors, among others. In addition, those who attended these activities visited the FISU Museum and learnt about its history and international skills.



2nd FISU America Forum

With the successful edition of its second forum in Mexico, under the axis “Sport in the University Curriculum”, FISU America satisfactorily completed the schedule of activities planned for the year 2018. It was organized from November 22 to 24, together with the Anahuac Mexico University North Campus, located in Huixquilucan, and the National Council of Sports Education (CONDDE), presided by Manuel Merodio Reza.



There were 9 exhibitions per day, among which the experiences of the different participating national federations were commented, round tables of debate in relation to different topics related to university sport, and cultural activities, among which were highlighted a regional dance demonstration, visits to pyramids and dinner in one of the oldest canteen in the country, with a live musical show.



The event had the distinguished presence of Eric Saintrod, Secretary General of FISU, besides 100 participants of 15 universities from Mexico, Chile, Costa Rica, Colombia, El Salvador, Peru and Venezuela.

The president of FISU America, Alim Maluf Neto, said, “I want to thank the Organizing Committee for giving us all the possible structure and also all the love and friendship to the forum participants. I also thank the members of the Executive Committee of FISU America who worked hard in the preparation of the event, and all the speakers who brightened up our event with their experiences, especially the representatives of national federations.

2019 FISU America Schedule

In the continental calendar for the future, the organization has planned another three principal activities. The second strategic dialogue FISU-FISU America will be held in Bogotá, Colombia, in May. The third 3x3 Cup will be in Maceió, Brazil, in June. And the first FISU America Futsal Championship will take place in Misiones, Argentina, in October.



2018 has been a productive year for FISU Oceania and its member NUSFs.

Governance

FISU Oceania is a small CUSF with its secretariat services administered and supported by UniSport Australia. With 12 NUSF members, the region is geographically dispersed however this does not hinder collaboration and participation in FISU and FISU Oceania programs/ events. The 12 members of FISU Oceania include: American Samoa, Australia, Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Guam, Papua New Guinea, Marshall Islands, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Northern Mariana Islands and Samoa.

Two Executive Committee meetings were held where key programs were discussed and reporting on activities in the region and wider FISU events were conducted. FISU Oceania President, Martin Doulton also attended numerous key FISU events including FISU EC meetings in March and September, WUC American

Football in June as FISU’s representative, AUSF General Assembly in October and NUSF seminar in November. During attendance at the AUSF General Assembly, FISU Oceania renewed its MOU relations with AUSF until the end of 2020. This comes after a successful MOU for 2017/2018 where the two organisations worked collaboratively on education and sporting programs providing opportunities to member NUSFs and students.

Mini Dialogue

Held in conjunction with the UniSport Australia General Assembly and National Conference, the FISU Oceania Mini Dialogue was held in May with seven countries in attendance. The key point of discussion was “What would



make University Sport truly inclusive”. This topic saw in depth discussions focussing on what inclusion looks like for university sport, what are the needs and wants of those who feel they are excluded from university sport participation and how can universities and NUSFs fill the gap to ensure that inclusive programs are offered and available. All in attendance agreed that inclusion is important on a global, regional, national and local level and whilst NUSFs all operate in different environments, all NUSFs can be more proactive in the area of inclusion.

Events

A number of events were held in the FISU Oceania region in 2018. These events included 3x3 World League Qualifiers held in Australia and New Zealand as well as a



Football World Cup qualifier held in Australia.

New Zealand held national championships across 10 sports and Australia held national championships in 41 sports. Fiji held its annual Inter Tertiary Games in September attracting over 3000 students in 12 sports and Papua New Guinea held three key intervarsity events which coincided with International Day of Sport for Peace & Development, World Environment Day and World Student Day.



The winning teams from the 3x3 Qualification events attended the 3x3 World University League. The Oceania representative teams were from Lincoln University (NZ), University of Auckland (NZ), Macquarie University (AUS) and Monash University (AUS). These teams competed successfully on the world stage with the University of Auckland finishing 4th in the men's competition – the highest placing by an Oceania men's team in the history of the event.

IDUS Activities

The FISU Oceania region continued to expand its activities for International Day of University Sport. In 2018, the following events were held:
