Dear friends,

As the year 2019 draws to an end, we are at the start of 2020, the beginning of a new decade.

The Federation has had a very good year in 2019, complete with the hosting of four championships - Karate, 3x3 Basketball, Badminton, Cheerleading - and two educational projects - 2nd FISU-NUSF Seminar and two workshops during the Championships. Among the four Championships hosted, Karate and Badminton were inaugural events for AUSF, 3x3 Basketball was the qualifying tournament of FISU University World Cup, and Cheerleading was the preparatory event for the World University Cheerleading Championship 2020. Besides that, we are very proud to see that Jinjiang city of China has successfully hosted the 2019 FISU University World Cup – Football after hosting the AUSF Football Cup in 2018. Both Myongji University from Korea in the men's category and College of Asian Scholars from Thailand in the women's category qualified from the AUSF Football Cup in 2018 to enter the semi-finals of the 2019 FISU University World Cup – Football. These two Asian representatives finished with commendable bronze medals eventually. Over the years, our member federations have improved leaps and bounds in their ability to stage higher-level events and 2019 was no exception. The level of competition from the participating teams also amazed us with their excellent sporting performances.

What is more impressive is starting from 2019, the exciting moments of each AUSF event was fully covered and presented by our Media Committee, which was only set up at the beginning of 2019. They fulfilled their role not only in AUSF events, but also in FISU-NUSF Seminar themed "Media and Sports Development" that attracted almost 50 participants from Asia, Europe and Oceania engaging in the field of sports management and media. During the FISU Election in November in Turin, being one of the most dynamic and active continental federations, representatives from AUSF member federations won eight seats in the FISU Executive Committee, further strengthening the bond between FISU and AUSF.

Based on the achievements in 2019, we are very confident to embrace 2020 ahead. Next year, AUSF will continue to focus on building up the core values of its flagship events, on reviewing and updating its rules and regulations during the 2020 General Assembly to make them more current and relevant, and on generating more excitement and opportunities to enhance the development of university sports in Asia during the FISU-AUSF Strategic Dialogue in 2020.

AUSF belongs to all who care and support university sports. The achievement is commonly shared, but so must be the responsibility. I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the AUSF Executive Committee members to express my sincere gratitude to all the stakeholders -the member federations, the universities, FISU, Continental Federations, Asian Sports Federations, KELME and other partners for their consistent involvement and strong support without which we cannot move forward. We are confident that together we can make the journey a successful one for everyone.

Dear friends,

2019 was such a special year for our university sport, with opportunities to celebrate the birth of our movement and the creation of the Universiade in their country of origin. While Napoli 2019 showed that we have remained loyal to our roots, it was also a great reminder of how far these roots have spread! The warm Italian nights showed just how much progress university sport has made in Asia.

When the Universiade was first celebrated in Torino, in 1959, a single Asian national university sports federation's athletes performed well enough to put their country among the top ten. In 2019, five of the top ten were Asian, including Japan at the top of the table. The medal table is not the sole measure of success, of course, as it cannot fully describe the way student athletes are supported in achieving their full potential. But it was still a remarkable achievement.

Such achievements are no accident. They take hard work and imagination. The Asian University Sports Federation and its members have demonstrated both. The AUSF was the first continental federation to host a FISU Strategic Dialogue. We saw that progress consolidated in 2019, with a FISU NUSF Seminar. 50 Delegates from 14 countries and regions discussed sports development and also media initiatives: to have the greatest impact, we must be diligent in sharing the stories of our student athletes.

The AUSF and its members have been very generous hosts. 2019 saw this welcome tradition announce Chengdu as the home of the 31st FISU Summer World University Games, while the FISU University World Cup Football took place for the first time in Jinjiang. FISU is extremely grateful.

At continental level, AUSF events are going from strength to strength across a wide and exciting range of sports. 2019 saw Asian University Championships held in four sports. Karate and badminton formed the basis of competitions for the first time, joining 3x3 basketball and cheerleading. FISU offers its congratulations to all the participants and especially to the AUSF.

As we know, university sport goes far beyond formal competition. It was wonderful to see the International Day of University Sport being so widely celebrated in Asia. And to see the AUSF contribute directly to these celebrations at the first Asian University Badminton Championships.

Looking ahead to 2020, we see that the AUSF will continue to innovate, building on its 2019 successes with badminton and karate. Asian University Championships will be held for Bodybuilding and Tchoukball for the first time, joining four more sports.

While we remain conscious of our history it is only right that, like the young people we serve, we should look to the future with optimism and commitment. It has become clear that this is the attitude of the AUSF and its members. Long may it continue!

The Opening Ceremony for 1st Asian University Karate Championship 2019 was held at Macau Fisherman's Wharf with the attendance of representatives from AUSF, Organizing Committee, local authorities and the participants. AUSF Vice-President Jargalsaikhan Dorjsuren first appreciated the joint-efforts of all sides and wished athletes good performances in Macau, China. Then he declared the opening of the championship. Since now, athletes will fight for their glory in the next two days in Tap Seac Multisport Pavilion.



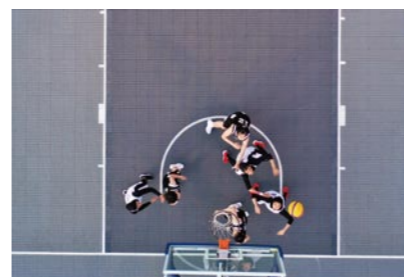

The 5th Asian University 3x3 Basketball Championship was successful concluded in Kinmen, Chinese Taipei on 12th May, 2019. By the time of the accreditation, there are originally 10 countries and regions coming all the way to Kinmen, Chinese Taipei to join this event, but team Philippines was founded that one of their athlete is not qualified due to the age limit, so team Philippine only got two qualified athletes, and according to FIBA's regulation, they cannot play in the official games but they can play friendship games with other teams. All athletes from China, Hong Kong China, Indonesia, Iran, Korea, Macau China, Malaysia, Mongolia and Chinese Taipei has shown us their best performance on the court.

Women's Final: CCU made three-peat successfully

FISU World Cup winner of 2017, CCU from TPE achieved a hattrick of wins in the 2019, 2018 and 2017 AUC3x3." The goal of coming to Kinmen is to win the title, and I was very touched by our players to achieve the goals we set," Coach Hui-yun CHENG said. As expected, they played well to beat their formidable opponents IAU from IRI by 15-6.



A very strong defense is the main reason for CCU's victory. The other factors are the good rebound by Yi-ching SU, and the accurate 2-point shooting of I-ting TAI.

Men's Final: Mon-Altius won the title first time

Apart from top level competition, To win their first title in the AUC 3x3, team Mon-Altius from Mongolia made an aggressive attack once the match began. Both teams had tall players, but Mon-Altius showed more strength. They extensively picked and rolled to score the points, and deployed one-on-one defense to tire the opponent at the same

time. Mon-Altius dominated the match by winning 20-12.

In addition to the main event, a three-point shootout contest took place at 4:20. The winner is Ulzii-Orshikh from Mon-Altius(MGL), who scored 11 points. The Awarding and Closing Ceremony were held immediately after the finals with attendance of 19 teams from 9 countries and regions. AUSF Delegate Kit-long LOU was grateful to all the participants, particularly support from FIBA, Kinmen County and CTUSF. Finally, he congratulated all the teams on their excellent performances in his closing speech.

2nd Asian University Cheerleading Championship

The 2nd Asian University Cheerleading Championship is staged officially from 24th to 25th August at the Seoul Plaza. It's the first time for Korea to host AUC Cheerleading, and to use an electronic scoring system in



cheerleading events at the same time.

The Opening Ceremony was witnessed by over 500 people at Seoul Plaza. After the President of Korea Cheerleading Association, Sun-Hwa LEE declared the AUCC open, local singer Seong-Ri KIM performed three beautiful songs and drew screams and active interaction from young spectators, which brought the ceremony to its climax.

In the next two days, a total of 192

participants from 8 countries and regions will compete for medals in seven divisions (Team Cheer including Large Coed Premier, Large Coed Elite, All-Female Elite; Performance Cheer including divisions of Pom Doubles, Hip-hop Doubles, Team Pom, and Team Hip-hop). On 25th August noon, the event will be broadcast live on KBS 1 to reach a wider audience.

With flawless performances at the 2nd Asian University Cheerleading Championships, Team Japan

grabbed four titles as expected and became the biggest winner at the Championship in Seoul, Korea over the weekend. On the final day of the competition, Seoul Plaza was filled with many spectators, witnessing the exciting finale from the many cheerleading teams from around Asia.

There was a total of seven divisional champions at the end of the competition, four of which belonged to Team Japan - All-Female Elite, Pom, Hip Hop, and Hip Hop Doubles. They executed their routines perfectly with passion and energy. "We tried hard to synchronize for each choreography. The complexity of our stunts and choreography was our biggest strengths, and that makes us a winner," said Matsuo MASAKI.

Japan's Hip Hop team's routine involved many hard techniques. It was not easy to train together before the competition as half the team live in Tokyo and half in Osaka. Despite this, their perseverance and commitment paid off in the end.

In the Final Round, most of teams achieved lower scores than in the 1st Round, except for Team China from Xiamen who won the Pom Doubles' gold medal with a higher



score. Team Malaysia took the Large Coed Elite first place, and Team Singapore brought home the Large Coed Premier title.

All athletes finished the championship successfully, and every team congratulated and encouraged each other for this historic moment for Asian Cheerleading. They are looking forward to the 3rd Asian University Cheerleading Championship.



1st Asian University Badminton Championship

1st Asian University Badminton Championship was held in New Taipei City, Chinese Taipei from 16th to 22nd September, 2019. Team China was undoubtedly the biggest winner, making 6 visits to the podium. They collected a total of 2 golds(women's and men's doubles), 1 silvers(mixed doubles), and 3 bronzes(men's doubles, mixed doubles and women's singles) which helped them to finish as the top team of the tournament.

In the women's doubles final, Peng Du/Bowen Ni(CHN) and Chiao-Yun Liu/Yu-Qiao Wang (TPE) fought a very hard battle in the first game but eventually the

Chinese prevailed taking China's first gold medal of the day. "We were nervous in the first game, but after some communication with each other to calm the nerves, we are glad to win the match finally," Ni said.

Continuing with the success of their women's doubles, China's men's doubles Haotian Wan/Haonan Xie defeated YoungSheng Lin/MingTse Yang(TPE) in a



very close match 21-17 15-21 25-27. Japan and Hong Kong China won one gold medal each.

The second seed of the men's

singles Takuma Obayashi(JPN) knocked out Junyan Ng(MAS) and expressed: "I am very happy to defeat the Youth Olympic runner-up Guipu Lin(CHN) in the semi-final. I feel the players at this tournament are of high standard and I get a lot of good exposure."

The gold medal of the women's singles went to Wen-Chi Hsu (TPE). Chinese Taipei also took home two silver medals in the women's doubles and men's doubles, and one bronze medal in men's singles.

Although the 1st AUC Badminton has successfully ended, the 2nd edition is but 2 years away and will again be held in Chinese Taipei. The plan is also to include a team event in the competition. The success of this inaugural event will in no doubt attract more participation in 2021!

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF UNIVERSITY SPORT
PROCLAIMED BY UNESCO
20th SEPTEMBER
2nd FISU-NUSF Seminar



The FISU-NUSF Seminar 2019 was a fruitful one, held on the International Day of University Sport. Almost 50 delegates from 18 countries and regions gathered in New Taipei City to exchange experience, best practices and challenges regarding 'Media and Sports Development'. At the end of the two-day seminar it emerged that member federations would actively welcome FISU's support in the specialised areas of media and marketing.

The seminar began with the President of FISU Oceania Martin Doultton getting everyone to warm up with a spot workout that was both, fun and ice breaking. FISU's Development Director Lilia Barieva then kicked things off in earnest, with the plenary sessions and workshops arranged according to the two themes. Several FISU member Continental and National University Sports Federations presented their development and media programmes; among them were Lou Kit Long from AUSF member Macau China, Donna Spethman from FISU Oceania (Australia) and Cornelius Papau of the Papua New Guinea Students Association.

FISU Media and Communication Manager Tina Sharma initiated the media workshops, followed by Sarah Anderson of New Zealand who shared the UTSNZ's rapid progress in social media strategy.

Fabio De Dominicis presented the European University Sports Association's (EUSA) comprehensive communication activity that covers 46 countries. Polly Wei from the host Chinese Taipei University Sports Association gave insights into their highly successful media volunteers programme.

"I believe all delegates have benefited from great presentations and discussions," said CTUSF Secretary-General Ching-Yu Tseng. "We wish we could have more such exchanges and work closely in the future."

Chinese Taipei University Sports Federation

Introduction of Chinese Taipei University Sports Federation(CTUSF)
CTUSF was established in 1957, with only 12 members originally. So far CTUSF has consisted of 164 university members, held more than 20 international events and trained more than 250 media volunteers.

From the following contents,

you will find 4 different parts of introduction included internal structure, internal events, international events and media achievement.

Internal Structure:

There are 25 full-time staffs and 8 departments in CTSUF, which are international affairs, accounting, administration, activities, digital

media, marketing, competition, research and development.

Internal Event

CTUSF organizes 4 major leagues and 36 university championships per year. In addition, CTUSF creates 4 mascots which all are the endemic species in Chinese Taipei for representing 4 major leagues. Visual identity elevates

these events' reputation but also could be one of promoting channel. These mascots are not only a set of cartoon characters, but also a symbol to unite university sports.

International Events:

From 1998, CTUSF starts to organize international events. There are 15 FISU events and 8 AUSF events be organized by CTUSF to the date. Holding international events could not only increase more organizing experience but also develop the local economics and local tourism.

Media Achievement:

During these years, CTUSF provides more convenient channel for audience to watch the on-line and recorded competitions. CTUSF has their own YouTube Channel and their Facebook page, specially, their own APP. This App provides all of the videos and competition information. It becomes easier for audience to reach these games. In 2014, CTUSF was awarded as "The Best YouTube Live Stream Channel" by YouTube. It is the first time to get this honor in sports organization in Chinese Taipei.

Besides, 2017 Taipei Summer Universiade organized by CTUSF and Taipei City Government is the most expressing international event for Chinese Taipei People. During this event, over 87% available tickets have been sold and there were almost 10,000 participants from 134 countries and regions taking part in. There are lots of famous university student athletes from Chinese Taipei, such as LEE Chih Kai (Artistic Gymnastics), KUO Hsing Chun (Weightlifting), TAI Tzu Ying (Badminton) and YANG Chun Han (Track and Field). CTUSF believes development of university sport is one of the key to encourage more

university students to take part in sport activities and watch the sport games on their own.

This year, CTUSF completed 2 Asian University Championships, 3x3 Basketball and badminton that attracted more than 200 participants came to Chinese Taipei. It was the first time for CTUSF to hold the international event in the offshore island. Though it brought some challenges to deliver the competition facilities and assist delegations from Taoyuan to Kinmen, CTUSF still did a great job to complete every part of organization. In the badminton championship, the number of participants was beyond their expectation which were 77 participants from 8 countries and regions in total. To continue creating more chance for Asian university students, CTUSF will hold some international event next year, you can see more details from following.

In addition, CTUSF held Media of University Sport Workshop for their university students to exchange their experience and realize the development of university sport. After learning from the workshop sessions, the university students knew more background of sport development and how to report in the sport events with their smart phone. CTUSF believes training the media volunteer could inspire more university students' motivation to participate in university sport events.

Mongolian Student Sports Federation celebrated 30th anniversary

On December 10, 2019 celebrated the 30th anniversary of the Mongolian Student Sports Federation (MSSF) at the Central library of National University of Mongolia. The MSSF was established on the June 25, 1989 by the decision of the National committee for sports and Physical Education of Mongolia, Mongolian Youth Federation, Mongolian

student union and Ministry of Education.

Anniversary ceremony attended by Executive committee members of MSSF, representatives of Ministry of Education, Culture, Science and Sports, Physical culture and sports authority of Mongolia, National Olympic committee of Mongolia, Mongolian Youth Federation, Mongolian Student Union and teachers, students of universities and colleges, coaches and athletes totally more than 100 people.

During the ceremony also celebrated the 97th anniversary (since 1922) of the development of university sports in Mongolia and the 60th anniversary of organize the first Universiade (since 1959) in Mongolia.

Mongolian athletes got 2 medal in Summer Universiade Napoli 2019

Since 1989 Federation successfully coordinate for developing physical culture education and sports among students of Mongolian universities, colleges and institutions and protect their solidarities, and represent Mongolia in the FISU and AUSF sports and education events.

Mongolian participation in the Winter Universiade Krasnoyarsk 2019

In this edition of Winter Universiade Mongolian national team participated with 16 athletes, 6 coaches and 4 officials. Farewell ceremony holds on February 26, 2019 at the Central Sports Palace.

Mongolian athletes competed in five sport events, such as cross-country skiing, ski-orienteering, short track, figure skating and freestyle skiing.

A feature of this Universiade, it is the first time that Mongolia has been represented in a prestigious international figure skating competition. Figure skater Maral-Erdene G., competed in the ladies' singles event and received 24.75 points, ranking 30th place.

Ski-orienteering and freestyle events also became a new challenge for the Mongolian team, as this was first time.

Also, 15 teachers took part in the FISU World on Innovation-Education-Sports conference 2019 in Krasnoyarsk during the

Mongolian 33 athletes, 13 coaches and officials from 7 sports for archery, shooting, judo, taekwondo, tennis, swimming and table tennis sport participated in the Summer Universiade held in Napoli, Italy 2019. The delegation was headed by Mr. Jargalsaikhan D., Secretary General of MSSF. The farewell ceremony organized on June 25, 2019 at the Central library of National University of Mongolia.

Judoka Baasanjargal B., won a bronze medal in the women's 63 kg weight category. Judoka Tsoigtbaatar Ts. took the 5th place.

Taekwondo athlete Tumenbayar M., at first time won the silver medal in men's 58kg weight category in taekwondo history participation. Also, shooter Esugen O., participated in the 10m air rifle women and took 6th place finishes with 162.2.

Mongolia organized MSSF National university championship 2019

Under management of the Mongolian Student Sports Federation in cooperation with universities, the National University Championship (NUC) 2019 were organized from March 11 to May 5 in 11 sport events - chess, volleyball, judo, wrestling, handball, taekwondo, futsal, table tennis, basketball, woodball and cheerleading in Ulaanbaatar city.

In total 2,114 people including 1,852 student athletes from

37 universities from the capital city and provinces of Mongolia, 175 coaches, teachers and 87 referees participated in the NUC 2019.

In accordance with the decision of the Executive committee, the right to organize sports events is granted to universities under the management of the Federation. Also, the committee makes the decision not to make a ranking of universities by the total sum but select the best universities who organized the championship at a high level.

National Dialogue on #IDUS2019

Every year since 2016 Mongolia began to celebrate the "International Day of University Sport" on September 20. In order to spread the idea of international university sports and promote their activities among students and youth, in this 2019, NUSF organized a "Universiade lesson" and a meeting of university sports.

In the morning, with the participation of 400 university students and teachers "Universiade Lesson" was presented by EC members of MSSF, while they covered several topics about activities of NUSF Mongolia and FISU, general information of the Universiade, and participation of Mongolian Team in the Napoli Universiade-2019, and also answered the students; questions of interest.

After the lesson, the attendees watched gifted students from the "Light Power" club of the MNIFE presented a basketball extreme show. The guest of honor of MSSF held a "Quiz Competition" for testing students; theoretical knowledge about Universiade and winners' team was awarded by "University sport, Universiade" book.

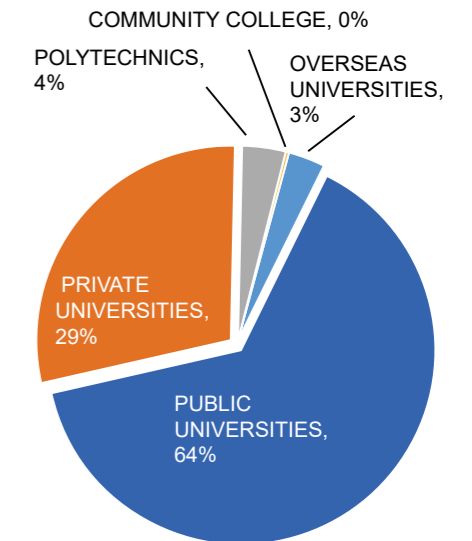

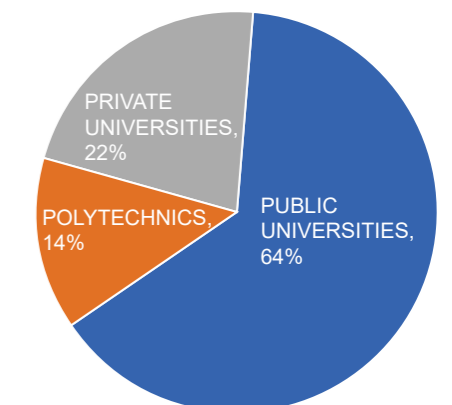

Arab University Sports Federation

Report on the Activities and Events of the Arab Universities Sports Federation In the Year 2019

The Arab University Futsal Tolerance Championship was held in Abu Dhabi in the United Arab Emirates under the sponsorship and presence of His Excellency Sheikh Nahyan Mubarak Al Nahyan, Minister of Tolerance and the Honorary President of the

Arab University Sports Federation, in the period from October 29 to November 9, with the participation of 13 Arab countries. Egypt won first place, followed by Oman, and Saudi Arabia came in the third place.

The Executive Office of the Arab Universities Sports Federation held its eighth meeting on 3 November 2019 at the Grand Millennium Hotel in Abu Dhabi in the presence of the head, Dr. Saeed Hamad Al Hassani and the membership of deputies, Secretary General, CEO and the members. Several decisions have been taken, the most important of which are:

1. The Executive Office decided unanimously to recommend the continuation of the presidency of the Arab Universities Sports Federation by Dr. Saeed Hamad Al Hassani for the high value he provided in the development of the work of the Arab Federation and for the Arab university sports.
2. The approval to honor the members of the Executive Office who served the Arab Universities Sports Federation, during the general assembly meeting to be held in Sultanate of Oman.
3. The organization of a student forum on the sidelines of one of the sports tournaments to be scheduled later.
4. Making an identification card for the distinguished members or the honorary members of the Arab Universities Sports Federation.

And the assignment of Mr. Ali Massari Al-Dhaheeri the Executive

Director of ARAB USF to make the required card.

The Executive Office of the Arab Universities Sports Federation, chaired by Dr. Saeed Hamad Al Hassani, held a meeting with both of Mr. Leonz Eder, First Vice President of the International Universities Sports Federation (FISU) and Mr. Shen ZHEN, Vice President of the Chinese Universities Sports Federation (FUSC) and Vice-President of the International Universities Sports Federation. On 3 November 2019, the two parties discussed the ways of cooperation between the Arab University Sports Federation on the one hand and the International Universities Sports Federation and the Chinese Universities Sports Federation.

AUSC IS READY FOR THE NEW DECADE

Malaysia will continue to lead the ASEAN University Sports Council (AUSC) for another term from 2020 until 2023.

The 4th AUSC General Assembly was held on 25th October 2019 in Kuala Lumpur in conjunction with the 25th AUSC Meeting which witnessed Associate Prof. Dr. Mohd Rushdan Mohd Jailani remained as the AUSC President and Mr. Roestam Effendi Sijar reappointed as the AUSC Secretary-General.

During the General Assembly, the representative from Brunei Darussalam proposed that AUSC leadership remain in Malaysia since its inception in 2010 based on the excellence track record. The motion was fully supported

by all ASEAN representatives and anonymously thanked the Government of Malaysia for the tremendous encouragement in supporting AUSC Secretariat and sports movement in ASEAN region.

According to AUSC President, with the confidence given by the members, it proved Malaysia's ability to manage an ASEAN university sports body well and systematically.

"With this mandate we will work harder to ensure that AUSC is on the international sporting map and the role of AUSC will be more important, especially in helping the AUSC Members to move forward in the field of sports and education," he said.

In conjunction with the 25th AUSC meeting, Thailand as the host of the 20th ASEAN University Games (AUG) in 2020 presented their preparation for the upcoming event at Ubon Ratchathani Rajhabat University from December 13 to 22, 2020 with 24 sports being offered. AUG 2020 will be the 20th edition organised in the new decade.

It coincides with Thailand also hosting the 15th AUG during the opening of the last decade in 2010. For a record, this is the 5th time Thailand hosted the biennial multi-sports games for ASEAN university student-athletes.

2019's Year of Legacy Paves Way for FISU's Future

As the International University Sports Federation embarked upon 2019, the 70-year-old federation found itself at a crossroads. On the one hand, it had come a long way since the first International University Sport Week in 1949 and was celebrating seven

decades of driving the university sports movement. On the other, the year marked many firsts that set the stage for a new and exciting future.

Krasnoyarsk 2019 Winter Universiade, 2 – 12 March 2019

The first big FISU sports event of the year was the Krasnoyarsk 2019 Winter Universiade, which

set a record of sorts with the participation of 58 countries and nearly 1,700 athletes. In Siberia, ski orienteering made its Universiade debut and the United Arab Emirates participated in the winter sport spectacle for the first time. It was also the first time ever that good wishes came from high above – as celebrated cosmonaut Oleg Kononenko spoke to the athletes from outer space during



the opening ceremony.

From the 5,000 smiling volunteers to the nearly flawless

performances of some of the gold medallists, the 29th edition of the Winter Universiade will go down in history for the emotions it incited.

thrives as its venues and facilities are now open to public and are being used enthusiastically by local Siberian clubs and communities alike.



FISU President Oleg Matytsin evoked these passions when he thanked the Krasnoyarsk citizens by saying, “the days that we spent here, in the heart of Siberia, will always remain in our memory!”

Napoli 2019 Summer Universiade, 3 – 14 July 2019

Just over three months later, more than 6,000 athletes representing around 120 countries marched into the Stadio San Paolo in Italy for the Napoli 2019 Summer Universiade. As per its motto, the 30th Summer Universiade was unique indeed – and not just because the Athletes' Village was housed on two luxury cruise ships.

The Krasnoyarsk 2019 legacy



The sun-soaked seaside city gave athletes and spectators an unparalleled setting for the biggest multi-sport event for student-athletes. A lasting image from the artistic and musical opening ceremony was the spellbinding performance of arguably the best tenor in the world today – Andrea Bocelli, whose melodious voice

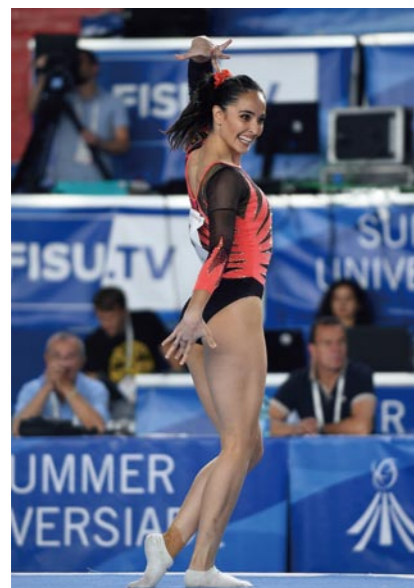


enthralled the spectators and resonated in Stadio San Paolo as the clock struck midnight to mark the opening of the games.

Sport took centre stage in Napoli, as it should, with the moment of crowning glory coming as the home nation closed the 12 days of competition with gold in the men's water polo final.

"It feels so very good, it was important to win in front of our supporters," said Italy's gold medal winning water polo captain, Umberto Esposito. "This is very emotional."

It was a perfect emotional moment to cap off a magical fortnight.



36th FISU General Assembly and Elections, 15-16 November in Turin, Italy

Later in the year, as FISU geared up to celebrate its 70th anniversary, it also prepared for a new era with a fresh Executive Committee that was elected during the 36th FISU General Assembly held in Turin, Italy, in November. President Oleg Matytsin was once again endorsed as FISU President for a further four-year term. In a historic development, Penninah Aligawesa Kabenge from Uganda was elected as the federation's first-ever female Vice President.

The four-year term of the Executive Committee officials elected in Turin will cover Universiades to be held in Lucerne and Chengdu in 2021 and Lake Placid and Ekaterinberg in 2023.

University World Cups, 3x3 and Football

The FISU sporting season in 2019 closed with the two University World Cups, the unique tournaments with the university-versus-university format rather than national teams. A successful fifth edition of the FISU University World Cup 3x3 was staged in Xiamen, China. The inaugural

KELME 2019 FISU University World Cup - Football soon followed in Jinjiang, also in China.

FISU's newest sports property set the bar high as it played out from 21 November to 1 December 2019. The tournament in Jinjiang paved the way for the future of university-versus-university competition in the world's most popular sport.

After almost a year of training, preparation and continental qualifying tournaments, more than 400 student-athletes arrived in Jinjiang to play a total of 62 matches over 11 days. Most of the teams were raring to go, to take a shot at being crowned the first-ever 'University World Cup Champion' in football.

"We came to this competition to become the champions," said Igor Miliorsan of Paulista University upon his arrival in Jinjiang. "It is a great experience because for many of us it is our first time travelling outside Brazil."

The tournament created waves even before the first kick-off as one of FIFA's '125 greatest living footballers' arrived in Jinjiang to unveil the distinctive trophy. Argentine football legend Juan Sebastián Verón gave the green signal for the games to begin and had a word of inspiration for the participating student-athletes.

"It's important that you have a dream and follow it," said Verón, who made his event entrance by walking hand-in-hand with two local ball kids.

With the green signal from one of the best-ever, the tournament was off to a scintillating start. The stadiums in Jinjiang, many of which were purpose-built for this event, provided the perfect setting for some fantastic matches.

As the tournament progressed,

the women's team from the University of Ottawa made news for more reasons than one. The firebrands from Canada, known as the 'Gee-Gees', seared their way through the draw even as they studied furiously for exams during the day.

"We have been trying to balance school and soccer while we've been here," said goalkeeper Margot Annie Shore, the undisputed star of Ottawa's semi-final victory against Beijing Normal University.

"Most of us start exams as soon as we get back, so we are all trying to keep up with our schoolwork here in Jinjiang!"

The sheer effort of keeping up with academics and reaching the final at the same time was not lost on anyone and the Canadians became immensely popular with local fans and other teams alike.

They did not disappoint in the final either, as Mikayla Morton's second-minute goal against Paulista University proved to be enough for the title.

After 11 days, 61 matches, and 206 goals scored, it finally came down to the University of Wollongong from Australia taking on the University of the Republic



from Uruguay in the men's grand finale that was played out in a packed Jinjiang Football Park Stadium before 7,500 spectators.

Befitting a grand finale, the match went 1-1 into halftime, then into full time and finally into 30 minutes extra time. The decisive moment came when University of the Republic's captain Santiago Pallares Palomeque scored of a penalty kick just six minutes before the match would have gone into a shootout. It was enough for the title.

"I was trying to be as calm as possible in that moment because it was a decisive one," the Player of the Tournament said after the victory. "I tried to bring myself into a calm state and get some power

inside me."

When the winning team was asked if the final was their toughest match of the tournament, Head Coach Alejandro Heguy Charamelo immediately said, "Yes, of course, a final is a final. In our country we say you don't play a final, you only win a final!"

"Thank you to the people of Jinjiang for being so helpful and receptive to us," he added. "The people here were truly amazing."

2020 World University Championships season

The FISU University World Cup – Football returns to Jinjiang in 2021. Until then, an action-packed 2020 World University Season beckons, with 29 events dotted through the year starting March and ending in late November. The year 2020 will also see the sixth edition of the University World Cup 3x3, the FISU Forum in August that will be held in Budapest, Hungary, and the fourth FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy in Kazan, Russian Federation that will yet again bring together hundreds of future leaders from around the world.

At the International University Sports Federation, excitement never stops.

European University Sports Federation

European University Sports Association (EUSA)

2019 was another busy and momentous year for the European University Sports Association, which celebrated 20 years since its founding in 1999.

The association's main 20th anniversary celebrations took place in Aveiro, Portugal at the occasion of the 2019 EUSA Conference, Extraordinary General Assembly and Awards



Ceremony, held between September 26-28.

The Conference brought together EUSA's member associations, partners, invited guests, speakers and local university authorities to discuss various topics regarding university sport, its challenges and future plans, with over 150 participants present, which included guests from visiting countries and continents. Several round table discussions were held in a number of varying and interesting topics including good governance, female leadership in sport and reflections over the past two decades of EUSA.

The following day, EUSA's Extraordinary General Assembly took place at the University of Aveiro, hosted by the Portuguese Academic Federation of University Sport (FADU). The main aim of the assembly was to adopt changes in the EUSA Statutes and regulations. The modifications came as a result of discussions with members and partner organisations over the previous years, in line with changes to

the International University Sport Federation (FISU) Statutes, and followed recommendations and good practices promoted at global level by FISU and at continental level by the European Commission and European Council.

Following the conclusion of the Conference, the highly-anticipated EUSA Awards Ceremony was held at the magnificent Teatro Aveirense to recognise the stand-out achievements of individuals, universities and associations who excelled in EUSA events over 2018.

Apart from the regular annual awards given to deserving performers from the previous year, three special awards were handed out on the night, recognising the efforts and contributions of those who have especially excelled over the past decade of EUSA, from 2009-2019. The German University Sports Federation was named EUSA's Most Successful National University Sport Federation (NUSA) over the last ten-year period, the University

of Minho received the Best University Award while FISU President Mr Oleg Matytsin was present to receive a special Order of Merit for his extraordinary support and unmatched devotion to university sport over the past decade.

On the sports front, 2019 was another record-breaking year for EUSA following an eventful summer which saw 21 different sports competitions organised as part of the European Universities Championships programme, which were held in 14 host cities in nine different countries across Europe.

Four sports were included in the official programme for the first time including Beach Handball, Kickboxing, Orienteering and Water Polo, with competitions in Golf, Badminton, Handball, Table Tennis, Futsal, Basketball, Football, Beach Volleyball, Tennis, Bridge, Chess, Volleyball, 3x3 Basketball, Judo, Karate, Taekwondo and Rowing making it the largest Championship programme in EUSA's history.





In total, 5 242 participants representing over 550 universities from over 40 different countries participated in this year's European Universities Championships, making it the most-attended EUSA Championships ever following the previous total of 4 132 participants in 2017.

Building on already existing partnerships and relationships with sports bodies across the continent, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed between EUSA and the European Judo Union (EJU), strengthening general cooperation and partnership between the two organisations.

EUSA was also active in the field of education over the year, organising the very first edition of the FISU-EUSA Seminar which took place in Kranjska Gora,

Slovenia. The Seminar gathered representatives from FISU and EUSA members associations and staff to discuss and converse over a wide variety of topics in relation to university sport. Presentations, round tables and workshops at the Seminar revolved around the legacy of university sports events, funding opportunities and development programmes, social responsibilities in sport, the international day of university sport and media coverage at various events.

A number of events across 2019 revolved around preparations for the fifth edition of the European Universities Games (EUG2020) taking place in Belgrade, Serbia from July 12-25 2020. A first Transfer of Knowledge meeting was held between members of the European Universities Games Organising Committees of both Zagreb-Rijeka 2016 and Coimbra 2018, and the

organisers of Belgrade 2020 in Serbia. Following this, more than 80 participants were present at the EUSA EUG2020 Belgrade Convention, held in the Serbian capital between May 30 and June 1. The Convention brought together EUSA's Technical Commission and Office Staff, the EUG2020 Organising Committee and representatives from Serbia's National and Regional Sport Federations to discuss various aspects ahead of the following year's European Universities Games. The Convention was part of the knowledge-sharing process within the Supporting Mobility and Good Practice Exchange in University Sport, supported by the European Union.

EUSA's Executive Committee met on four occasions over 2019. Two were extraordinary Executive Committee meetings, held in Napoli, Italy at the occasion of the FISU Summer Universiade and in

Aveiro, Portugal prior to the EUSA Conference and Extraordinary General Assembly. The other two gatherings took place in Antalya, Turkey and Ljubljana, Slovenia.

Through the EUSA Institute, the association is involved in a number of transnational projects covering topics varying from mobility in sport, equal opportunities, dual career and volunteering to gender equality, anti-doping and safe-guarding in sport.

EUSA was again recognised by the European Commission as one of the official partners of the European Week of Sport, aimed to promote sport and physical activity across Europe. Now in its fifth year, the week-long event ran from September 23 to 30, with a range of activities and events taking place across Europe, encouraging people to #BeActive. EUSA is also actively promoting the International Day of University Sport which is celebrated world-



wide on September 20, and annually carries out activities celebrating both initiatives, as well as encourages its 46 members to do the same.

EUSA's main event for 2020 will be the European Universities Games in Belgrade, where over 5 500 participants are expected to take part in 19 different sporting disciplines, as well as two disciplines for student-athletes

with disabilities: Para Judo and Para Table Tennis. Licensed EUSA and endorsed by FISU, the event enjoys highest national and local support, and is set to be the biggest European university sport event ever held on the continent.

Introduction

FISU AMERICA concentrate and coordinate the efforts of the university sport organizations of the continent. Our main purpose is giving the conditions for the overall development of the athletes students in the region through the competitive sport and academic activities, representing the region before the FISU.

Ordinary Assembly of the CADE-Panam Sports alliance

In February, and in the context of the Ordinary Assembly of the CADE, the President and the authorities of FISU AMERICA had a meeting with Neven Ilic,

President of Panam Sports, entity which groups all the Olympic committees of America and organize the Pan-American Games. The main idea of this agreement is to increase the number of athletes with tertiary studies.

17th Central America and Caribbean Games Tunja 2019

The 17th Central America and Caribbean University Games were organized in Tunja, Colombia. Seven countries contended in eleven sport disciplines. This competition was important to promote university sports in the area.

2nd Strategic Dialogue FISU-FISU AMERICA

On 21st and 22nd of May, the NUSF of America met in Bogotá to talk about the future of the university sports in the continental federation. In this second edition of the Strategic Dialogue FISU-FISU AMERICA, sixteen countries from America, members of EUSA, AUSF and FISU, were part of this event in which they discussed the main topics and challenges that the university sports has to face. Some issues were: Gender Equality, IDUS, growth of national and continental university leagues, the importance of doing exercise and study.

31st Summer Universiade Napoli 2019

The 31st Summer Universiade Napoli 2019 was a great universiade for FISU AMERICA, twelve countries represented, 100 medals won and hundreds of student athletes representing their nations. USA obtained 53 medals, Mexico 21, ending both in the top10 medal board, and Trinidad and Tobago won its first medal ever in a summer universiade, adding a silver to the America's total.

3rd FISU AMERICA 3x3

6.The 3rd FISU AMERICA 3x3, was carried out in Maceió, Brazil, from 8th to 10th of August. The best 10 male and 13 female teams in the continent played for their place in the WUC FISU 3x3. Seven countries participated, being the boys of the UNIP(BRA), Universidad de Chile (CHI) and UNLaM (ARG), and the girls of the ITESM(MEX), Universidad de Chile (CHI) and PUCV (CHI) who got their tickets to China.

FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy

Sixteen American countries and the CUSF's representative participated in the FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy in September (5-11). The FISU AMBASSADORS shared ideas, worked in groups and learned all they must know about the organization of a sport event. They also had time for games, visits to the city and physical activity. In the case of Argentina, they sent a representative to present and bring information for the 2020 WUC Rugby Sevens.

IDUS in America

The IDUS is a really important day for the University Sports, and the universities from every corner of the continent celebrated it with colourful celebrations, festivals, and activities for the students and their families in the facilities of their universities.

1st FISU AMERICA FUTSAL

The 1st FISU AMERICA FUTSAL was carried out this year in Posadas, Argentina. Universities from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Mexico and Peru played for the first Pan-American of Futsal, where ten men teams and six women teams played for the trophy. Finally, the girls of the ITESM(MEX) and the boys from the UNLaM(ARG) were the champions of this edition.

WUC 3x3, Xiamen

In the WUC 3X3 Xiamen China, the teams classified in the FISU AMERICA 3X3, make us vibrate with their amazing plays and exhibitions of skills during the tournament. The male team of UNIP(BRA)who had been the best of the continent, also proved to be the best team of the planet. The UNIP raised up the trophy demonstrating that in America we play 3x3.

WUC Football, Jinjiang

The most popular sport in the planet, football, had its first WUC FISU this year in Jinjiang, and America had an important role. Two women teams from the continent were present and not only did a great tournament, but also both played the final game

where the University of Ottawa beat the UNIP(BRA), bringing the 1st and 2nd place of the World Cup to America. In the male branch, three teams were part, and the UNIP was in the top8, while the Universidad Autónoma del Estado de México(MEX), achieved the semi-finals, losing against the World Champion, the Universidad de la República from Uruguay. America loves football, and with two world champions has shown that it has a great level.

2nd FISU AMERICA Games Merida 2020

After the great success in the 1st FISU AMERICA Games São Paulo 2018, and on defining university sport competitions for the 2020, FISU AMERICA has chosen the city of Merida, Mexico to host the 2nd FISU AMERICA GAMES. The decision made by the committee of the CUSF to keep developing the university sport in the area, and everything CONDDE(Mexico's Federation) has been doing for the last years, tipped the balance to organize the games in Mexican soil. This kind of competitions make university sports keep growing.

FISU OCEANIA 2019 REPORT FOR EUSA AND AUSF MAGAZINES

2019 has been a productive year for FISU Oceania with further development of its projects and activities as well as continued attendance at FISU events. The ability to continually provide opportunities for Oceania student

athletes and improve governance practices of its members were the two key areas of focus for 2019. The support FISU Oceania can provide to all its nations (many of which are developing nations), will continue to see the expansion of university sport in the region. FISU Oceania is a small continental university sport federation (CUSF) with 12 National University Sport Federations (NUSF) members. The region is geographically

dispersed however this does not hinder collaboration and participation in FISU and FISU Oceania programs/events. Member countries include: American Samoa, Australia, Cook Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Fiji, Guam, Marshall Islands, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Northern Mariana Islands, Papua New Guinea and Samoa.

FISU Oceania supports key FISU programs such as the FISU Volunteer Leaders Academy and Young Reporters Program. Students from Australia and New Zealand were selected to be a part of these key student events in 2019. International Day of University Sport also continues to be a key event in the region. Events were held in Australia, Fiji, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea.

FISU Oceania General Assembly

FISU Oceania held its General Assembly in November 2019 in Turin Italy to coincide with the FISU General Assembly in the same city. With the completion of his term, Martin Doulton officially stood down as President and David Schmude AUS was elected



as the new President for the coming mandate period (2019-2023). Nicola Clayden NZL was elected as Vice President with Michael White NMI, Amy Sasser MHL and Alifereti Cawanibuka FIJ all elected to the executive committee.

MOU Partnerships

In 2019, Oceania contributed to the FISU-NUSF seminar held in New Taipei City TPE in September via provision of presenters and facilitators. This support was provided as a part of the MOU between Asian University Sports Federation and FISU Oceania. Delegates from Northern Mariana Islands, Papua New Guinea, New Zealand and Australia attended this event which coincided with International Day of University Sport and the 1st Asia University

Badminton Championships.

Summer & Winter Universiade

Australia participated in the Winter

Universiade in Krasnoyarsk RUS. Australia sent a small team of 11 student athletes, and competed in Freestyle Skiing, Figure Skating, Snowboard, Speed Skating and Cross Country events.





Football World Cup

Oceania was represented in the men's tournament by University of Wollongong AUS (final placing 2nd) and in the women's tournament by The University of Sydney AUS (final placing 6th). Marcus Beattie from Wollongong won the Golden Boot award for most goals scored, capping off a successful competition journey for the men's team.

Both Australia and New Zealand sent large teams to the Summer Universiade in Naples ITA. Australia achieved medals in Athletics, Basketball and Swimming. The Australian women's Basketball team was successful in defending their gold medal from the Universiade in Taipei (2017). New Zealand were also successful in achieving medals in Athletics.

3x3 World Cup

Oceania was represented at the 3x3 University World Cup by Macquarie University AUS (final placing 5th) and University of Otago NZL (final placing 6th) in the men's competition and by University of Technology Sydney AUS (final placing 8th) and Lincoln University NZL (final placing 10th) in the women's competition.

MyUniSport workshops

MyUniSport is the education program of FISU Oceania. The program is adaptable to the needs of the Federation in which workshops are hosted and include the topics of event management, touring team management, incident management and team leadership. In 2019, two workshops were held in Papua



New Guinea (200 delegates focusing on the topic of leadership) and Fiji (20 delegates focusing on event management).

- University and Tertiary Sport New Zealand national championships were contested across ten sports. The University of Auckland won the overall champion university title

-Continued promotion of FISU in the region

-Expansion of IDUS activities

At the 2019 General Assembly, a new strategy for FISU Oceania was developed and this will also be a key focus to ensure it is managed and NUSFs continue to contribute to programs and activities within our region.

Finally, FISU Oceania would like to recognise Martin Doulton and thank him for his contribution to our Federation. Martin completed his term as President in November 2019 and has had a long association with FISU Oceania from initially being Secretary General and then President. Martin was elected to the FISU Executive Committee in November, and we know that whilst his executive role with our Federation might be completed, he will continue to be a voice for our region.



Oceania NUSF events

Oceania NUSFs continue to host a number of sport events amongst their various programs. Some highlights included:

- UniSport Australia National Championships held across 44 sports. The University of Sydney were crowned overall champion university

- Fiji Inter Tertiary Games were held in September attracting over 2,000 students across seven sports. Fiji National University won the title of overall champion university

- University of New Caledonia Futsal team competed against national teams from Pacific Nations who were in New Caledonia attending the Futsal Nations Cup

- Papua New Guinea hosted four intervarsity tournaments throughout the year expanding this program to include more tertiary institutions across the country

The coming year will bring more opportunities for Oceania NUSFs and students within the region. Key projects for 2020 include:

-Rebranding of FISU Oceania to meet current FISU branding guidelines

-Hosting a successful 3x3 qualifying event
