### General Terms

The competitions shall be organized in accordance with the most recent technical regulation of the Badminton World Federation (BWF). In any dispute the English text shall be regarded as authoritative.

The program and duration of the competitions have been decided by the AUSF Executive Committee in agreement with the Organizing Committee. In principle, the program will last five days and will include the following events:

a. Individual Events

b. Mixed Team Events

Men	Women
8-team tournament	

Each country/region is authorized to enter one team which is composed of a maximum of six (6) athletes in each gender as the follows and enter three (3) officials in maximum.

a) Individual Events:

	Men	Women
Single	3 players	3 players
Double	3 pairs	3 pairs
Mixed Double	3 pairs	

No player may enter more than two individual events, for example, one singles, and one doubles, or two doubles.

b) Mixed Team Events:

	Men	Women	Team
Minimum	2 players	2 players	1 Team
Maximum	6 players	6 players	

To prevent the injuries, a minimum of 3 men and 3 women is recommended.

No players shall play in more than two matches of each tie. During the group stage, all five matches of each tie shall be played. During the elimination stage, each tie shall be stopped when the result of the tie has been decided.

Each tie will consist of 1 men's singles, 1 women's singles and 1 mixed doubles.

### Eligibility

All athletes must satisfy the following conditions:

- a) Be at least 17 and less than 28 years of age on January 1st 2026, which means eligible athletes must be born between January 1, 1998, and December 31, 2008.
- b) Be a student who is currently officially registered as proceeding towards a degree or diploma at a university or similar institute whose status is recognized by the appropriate academic authority of his/her country(region).
- c) Former students of the institutions mentioned in **b)** who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the year preceding the event.
- d) Must hold a current passport of the country/region he/she represents, unless he/she is an international student.
- e) An international student must hold a current passport of the country/region he/she comes from as well as the student ID card.
- f) International student may participate but their numbers must be capped at 20% of the registered team.

a. **Registration Fee (be collected by AUSF)**

<b>AUSF Member</b>	USD 10 per person
<b>Non-AUSF Member</b>	USD 20 per person

## b. Participation Fee (be collected by OC)

<b>USD 60</b>	per person per night
<b>USD 150</b>	per extra-official per night

- \* If a participating team registers more than the limited number of officials, the additional persons will be regarded as extra-officials.
- \* OC is NOT responsible for delegation who arrive before 8<sup>th</sup> June and/or depart after 15<sup>th</sup> June.

### Deadline for Entries

- \*Passport must have a validity of at least 6 months after the return trip.
- \*Passport, original individual entry form and academic eligibility form should be brought to Chinese Taipei for accreditation purpose.

### Insurance

AUSF and OC shall not be responsible for any claim or loss, injury or damage arising from the holding of this championship.

All participating country/region must have their appropriate insurance to cover travel and participation as these are not the responsibility of OC and AUSF.

### Doping Control

Doping control will be conducted during the competition according to the latest AUSF Anti-Doping Rules. If competitor is following a course of medical treatment, he/she must obtain the certification (TUE) to that effect and inform OC immediately upon arrival. Selected athletes may be accompanied by a team official during doping control procedures.

### Accommodation and Transportation

A nearby designated hotel of international standard will be arranged by the OC to accommodate officials, athletes, as well as AUSF families and technical officials. Detailed hotel information will be provided once confirmed. The OC will also be responsible for local transportation between the official entry points and the designated hotel.

### AUSF Help Program

The AUSF Help Program is formulated to provide financial support to AUSF active members representing countries/regions with per capita USD 3,500 or less according to the latest figures provided by World Bank (<https://reurl.cc/R6ybYz>) to enable them

to send their student-athletes and/or officials to participate in the AUC. The specific regulation could be found attached.

For 2026 AUC Badminton, AUSF members/ NUSFs for the Help Program should pay attention to the following timelines:

- The application form should be submitted to AUSF before 22nd December, 2025;
- All forms will be evaluated from 22nd December, 2025 to 22nd January, 2026
- NUSFs selected for the Help Programs should submit personal information of athletes (passport copies, pictures, academic eligibility forms, declarations, together with sports event participation proof) by 10th March, 2026
- Help program report from the participants/NUSFs must be submitted to AUSF within 1 month after the event
- AUSF will only reimburse to the NUSF the amount approved after receiving the final report from the NUSF.
